## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 36-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows:
- 7 Feral swine Prohibited acts Penalty.
- 8 1. In this section "swine" means a hog, boar, or pig.
- 9 2. In this section "feral swine" means:
- 10 <u>a.</u> Any untamed or undomesticated swine;
- b. Swine whose reversion from domesticated to wild is apparent; and
- c. Freely roaming swine having no readily visible tags, markings, or
  characteristics to indicate the swine is from a domestic herd, and reasonable
  inquiry within the area does not identify an owner.
- 14 <u>inquiry within the area does not identify an owner.</u>
- 4. A person may not intentionally, knowingly, or negligently release or allow swine to
  live in a wild or feral state.

A person may not import, transport, or possess live feral swine.

- 5. A person may not engage in, sponsor, assist, or profit from the release, hunting, or
  trapping of feral swine.
- 6. A person that violates this section is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed five
  thousand dollars per violation. In addition, a person that violates this section,
  causing the board or another government entity to incur costs to control or destroy
  the feral swine, may be required, in an action brought by the board, to pay those
  costs.

- 1 7. The board may destroy or require the destruction of feral swine. To carry out this 2 work, the board may cooperate with other governmental entities or engage private 3 contractors. 4 This section does not prevent owners or legal occupants of land, or their agents, 8. 5 from destroying feral swine found on their land, provided they act under a permit 6 issued by the board and the permit is in their possession when the destruction 7 occurs. The board may impose conditions on issuing a permit, such as limits on its 8 duration and the duty to report kills and to make the animal available for disease 9 testing. 10 The board's authority under this section may be delegated to and carried out by the <u>9.</u> 11 state veterinarian, and in an emergency the state veterinarian may carry out this 12 section without consulting the board.
  - 10. This section does not apply to swine contained within an approved, compliant, nontraditional livestock swine facility.
