- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 36-26 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 2 to feral swine; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 36-26 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted

- 6 **36-26-01. Definitions.** As used in this chapter:
 - 1. "Board" means the state board of animal health.
- 8 2. "Feral swine" means a hog, boar, or pig that:
- 9 Appears to be untamed or undomesticated; a.
- 10 Appears to have reverted from a domesticated to a wild state; and b.
- 11 Is freeroaming. C.
- 12 **36-26-02.** Board - Authority. The board is responsible for the control and eradication
- 13 of feral swine on state lands and on private lands in this state.
- 14 36-26-03. Prohibited actions. 15 1. A person may not import, transport, or possess live feral swine. A person may not intentionally, knowingly, or negligently allow swine to live in a 16 2. 17 feral state. 18 3. A person may not: a. 19 (1) Hunt or trap feral swine; Sponsor or promote the hunting or trapping of feral swine: 20 (2)
 - (3) Assist in the hunting or trapping of feral swine;
- 22 (4) Profit from the release of feral swine; or

 - (5) Profit from the hunting or trapping of feral swine.

5	<u>1.</u>	<u>Any</u>	person having reason to believe that feral swine are present on property
6		<u>own</u>	ed by or legally occupied by that person shall notify the board and cooperate
7		<u>with</u>	the board in controlling or eradicating the feral swine.
8	<u>2.</u>	<u>a.</u>	Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, if a person encounters a
9			feral swine on property owned by or legally occupied by that person and
10			determines that the feral swine poses a threat of harm or destruction of
11			property, the person may immediately eradicate the feral swine.
12		<u>b.</u>	Any person eradicating a swine under this subsection shall notify the board as
13			soon as practicable, but in no event later than twenty-four hours after the time
14			of the eradication. The person shall follow any instructions given by the board
15			with respect to the handling of the carcass, preservation of the carcass for
16			testing, and disposal of the carcass.

19		<u>a.</u>	A civil penalty in an amount not exceeding five thousand dollars per violation;

22			federal government agency as a result of the person's violation.
23	<u>2.</u>	<u>Any</u>	person violating section 36-26-04 is subject to a civil penalty in an amount not
24		exce	eeding two hundred fifty dollars for a first offense and a civil penalty in an
25		amo	ount not exceeding five thousand dollars for a subsequent offense.
