- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 4-01-17.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to control of predatory animals, destructive birds, and injurious field rodents.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-01-17.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 4-01-17.1. State to cooperate with the animal and plant health inspection service
- 7 and other agencies in destruction of predatory animals, destructive birds, and injurious
- 8 **field rodents.** The agriculture commissioner may cooperate with the United States department
- 9 of agriculture, animal and plant health inspection service, or other appropriate federal agency,
- 10 in the control and destruction of coyotes, wolves, bobcats, and foxes <u>fur-bearers</u> that are
- 11 injurious to livestock, poultry, and big and small game; injurious field rodents in rural areas and
- 12 deer; and certain nongame species of birds causing crop damage or substantial economic loss
- 13 or threatening human health. This control and destruction must be approved by the director of
- 14 the game and fish department. The agriculture commissioner may enter into written
- 15 agreements with the animal and plant health inspection service or other appropriate federal
- 16 agency, and the director of the game and fish department covering the methods and
- 17 procedures for the control and destruction of these birds and animals, the extent of supervision
- 18 by either or both the agriculture commissioner and the animal and plant health inspection
- 19 service or other appropriate federal agency, and the use and expenditure of the funds
- 20 appropriated therefor by the legislative assembly. The agriculture commissioner, in cooperation
- 21 with the animal and plant health inspection service or other appropriate federal agency, may
- 22 enter into agreements with other governmental agencies and with counties, associations,
- 23 corporations, limited liability companies, or individuals when cooperation is deemed to be
- 24 necessary to promote the control and destruction of these birds and animals.
