ENGROSSED SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4033

- 1 A concurrent resolution urging the North Dakota Congressional Delegation and the Congress of
- 2 the United States to support worker freedom by opposing the federal Employee Free Choice
- 3 Act and any of the Act's related components.
- 4 **WHEREAS**, the right to a private secret ballot when voting on external representation is
- 5 fundamentally inherent in our representative republic and may not be infringed upon; and
- 6 WHEREAS, passage of the federal Employee Free Choice Act would replace a
- 7 federally supervised private ballot election with a system, known as "card check", whereby
- 8 employees publicly sign cards to vote for unionization; and
- 9 WHEREAS, 79 percent of Americans support a worker's right to a federally supervised

10 secret ballot election when deciding whether to join a union; and

11 WHEREAS, 77 percent of Republicans, 82 percent of Democrats, and 79 percent of

- 12 independents believe in protecting private ballots; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the federal Employee Free Choice Act's mandatory binding arbitration
- 14 provisions deny workers the right to participate in the collective bargaining process between
- 15 employees and the union; and

WHEREAS, efforts to eliminate private elections are an attack on the free speech rights
of businesses' and workers' individual rights; and

18 **WHEREAS**, North Dakota is a right-to-work state;

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA,

20 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

- 21 That the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly urges the North Dakota Congressional
- 22 Delegation and the Congress of the United States to support worker freedom by opposing the
- 23 federal Employee Free Choice Act and any of the Act's related components; and
- 24 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly expresses
- 25 opposition to "card check" legislation such as the federal Employee Free Choice Act, finding

- 1 such legislation is detrimental to the rights of workers and is an offense against democratic
- 2 principles; and
- 3 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
- 4 resolution to the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States
- 5 House of Representatives, and to each member of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation.
