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- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 23, subsection 13 of section
- 2 43-12.1-04, and section 43-12.1-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a nurse
- 3 aide registry, individuals exempt from regulation by the state board of nursing, and supervision
- 4 of nursing interventions; and to amend and reenact subsection 9 of section 43-12.1-02 and
- 5 section 43-12.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions, individuals exempt
- 6 from regulation by the state board of nursing, and delegation of medication administration.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 23 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 9 enacted as follows:
- Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the following definitions apply:
 - 1. "Certified nurse aide" means an individual who is registered on the nurse aide registry and who has either successfully completed the requirements for the department-approved training and competency evaluation program or has successfully completed the requirements of the department-approved competency evaluation program.
 - <u>2.</u> "Department" means the state department of health.
 - 3. "Home health aide" means an individual who is registered on the nurse aide registry and who renders personal related service under the supervision of a registered professional nurse.
- 4. "Medication assistant" means an individual who is registered on the nurse aide
 registry and who has successfully completed the requirements of a
 department-approved medication assistant program for a specific employment

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1 setting. A medication assistant may be designated a medication assistant I or a 2 medication assistant II. 3 5. "Nurse aide" means an individual who is registered on the nurse aide registry and 4 who has successfully completed the competency requirements identified by the 5 department to provide nursing or nursing-related services to an individual in a 6 health care facility or other setting. 7 "Nurse aide registry" means a listing of individuals who the department has 6. 8 determined have successfully completed the requirements established by the 9 department to be designated as certified nurse aide, home health aide, nurse aide, 10 or medication assistant. 11 Nurse aide registry - Rules. 12 <u>1.</u> The department shall establish and administer a nurse aide registry. The registry 13 must include disciplinary findings, including findings of abuse, neglect, or 14 misappropriation of property, and must include the eligibility of the individual to be 15 employed. 16 The health council shall adopt rules to regulate and register an individual who 2. 17 receives compensation for engaging in the provision of nursing or nursing-related 18 services to an individual in a health care facility or other setting. The rules do not 19 apply to a licensed health care professional practicing within the scope of that 20 profession, an unlicensed assistive person under chapter 43-12.1, or a volunteer in 21 the course of providing services without pay. In developing the rules, the health 22 council shall consult with the state board of nursing and other key stakeholders. 23 The rules required under subsection 2 must include the regulation of certified nurse 3. 24 aides, home health aides, medication assistants, and nurse aides. For each 25 category of regulated individuals, the rules must address: 26 Nurse aide registry requirements; <u>a.</u> 27 <u>b.</u> Training and competency requirements; 28 Approval of training programs; <u>C.</u>

7	<u>4.</u>	The department may not charge fees under this chapter for initial registration or
8		renewal of registration of an individual's registration status on the nurse aide
9		registry, consistent with federal prohibition of charging an individual for initial
10		registration or renewal of registration as a certified nurse aide.
11	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 9 of section 43-12.1-02 of the North Dakota
12	Century Co	de is amended and reenacted as follows:
13	9.	"Unlicensed assistive person" means an assistant to the nurse, other than an
14		individual who is registered on the nurse aide registry under section 1 of this Act,
15		who regardless of title is authorized by the board to perform nursing interventions
16		delegated and supervised by a nurse.
17	SEC	CTION 3. Subsection 13 of section 43-12.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
18	created and	I enacted as follows:
19	<u>13.</u>	An individual who is registered on the nurse aide registry under section 1 of this
20		Act, including a certified nurse aide, home health aide, nurse aide, and medication
21		assistant.
