Sixty-first Legislative Assembly of North Dakota

Introduced by

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 37-14-18, 37-18-07, 37-18-08, 37-18-12,

2 37-18.1-01, 37-18.1-02, 37-18.1-03, and 37-18.1-04, relating to county veterans' service

3 officers, the commissioner of the department of veterans affairs, and the administrative

4 committee on veterans' affairs, and to provide an appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 37-14-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 37-14-18. County veterans' service officer - Appointment - Duties. The board of 9 county commissioners of each county of the state of North Dakota shall appoint, employ, and 10 pay, on a full-time or part-time basis, an officer to be known as a county veterans' service 11 officer. An individual may serve as a county veterans' service officer in more than one county. 12 The appointment must be made with the prior advice of the commissioner of veterans' affairs, 13 and in accordance with veterans' preference as provided in section 37-19.1-02. The county veterans' service officer must be accredited by the national association of county veterans 14 15 service officers. It is the duty of the county veterans' service officer to become acquainted with 16 the laws, both state and federal, enacted for the benefit of returning servicemen and 17 servicewomen to assist such returning members of the armed forces in the presentation, proof, 18 and establishment of such claims, privileges, and rights as they have. It also is the duty of the 19 county veterans' service officer to actively cooperate with and to coordinate the activities of the 20 state and federal agencies within the county which the officer serves to facilitate their operation 21 and ensure promptness in the solution of the problems concerned with the reestablishment of 22 returning servicemen and servicewomen in civilian pursuits.

23 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 37-18-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 37-18-07. Commissioner - Appointment - Qualifications - Term - Salary. The 2 appointment, qualifications, term of office, and salary of the commissioner must be as 3 prescribed in section 37-18.1-03 commissioner shall be appointed by the governor. The 4 commissioner must qualify as a veteran as defined in section 37-01-40 and shall serve at the 5 pleasure of the governor. The commissioner must be allowed such amounts for travel, 6 clerkhire, and expenses as may be prescribed from time to time by legislative appropriations. 7 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 37-18-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 37-18-08. Office of commissioner - Where located. The office of the commissioner 10 shall be located in the same city as the principal office of the veterans' administrator for this 11 state. If the veterans' administrator is removed from the state, such commissioner's office must 12 be located in the state capitol Bismarck or Mandan. 13 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 37-18-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is 14 amended and reenacted as follows: 15 37-18-12. Funding authority - Continuing appropriation. The department of 16 veterans' affairs may accept and expend funds from any source, including federal or private 17 sources, to be used to assist veterans or qualified veterans' spouses in obtaining assistance 18 and to pay other expenses authorized by law incurred in carrying out programs of benefit and 19 service for resident North Dakota veterans as authorized by the administrative committee on 20 veterans' affairs with the approval of the emergency commission. However, all interest 21 earnings from the veterans' postwar trust fund received by the department of veterans' affairs 22 from the administrative committee on veterans' affairs are appropriated to the department on a 23 continuing basis. 24 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 37-18.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 25 amended and reenacted as follows: 26 37-18.1-01. Administrative committee on veterans' affairs - Membership -27 Appointment. There is hereby created an administrative committee on veterans' affairs, 28 which, for purposes of this chapter, must hereinafter be referred to as the committee. The 29 committee must consist of three ex officio nonvoting members and fifteen voting members. The 30 adjutant general, the center director of the veterans' administration, and the executive director of job service North Dakota are the ex officio nonvoting members who shall serve in an advisory 31

1 capacity to the committee. On or before June 20, 1971, the American legion, the veterans of 2 foreign wars, the disabled American veterans, the veterans of World War II, Korea, and 3 Vietnam, (amvets), and Vietnam veterans of America, incorporated, shall each prepare a list 4 containing the names of six persons qualifying as veterans under the provisions of section 5 37-01-40, for appointment as voting members of the committee. On or before July 1, 1971, the 6 governor shall select fifteen nominees, three from each list, five of whom must be appointed to 7 a term of three years, five of whom must be appointed to a term of two years, and five of whom 8 must be appointed to a term of one year, or until their successors are appointed and qualified. 9 On or before the twentieth day of June in each year, beginning in the year 1972, each of the 10 above-listed nominating organizations shall submit a list containing the names of two persons 11 who qualify as veterans under the provisions of section 37-01-40, to the governor for 12 appointment or reappointment as voting members of the committee. On or before the first day 13 of July in each year, beginning in the year 1972, the governor shall select one nominee from 14 each list, a total of five nominees, to fill expiring terms of voting members of the committee. 15 Each such appointment must be for a term of three years, or until a successor is appointed and 16 qualified. All terms begin on the first day of July and end on the thirtieth day of June in the year 17 specified. In case of the inability or failure of any voting member of the committee to serve, the 18 governor shall appoint another member from a list of two persons qualifying as veterans under 19 the provisions of section 37-01-40, submitted by the nominating organization represented by 20 the member who was unable or failed to serve. Such appointments must be made for the 21 remainder of the unexpired term. 22 There is created an administrative committee on veterans' affairs, which for the 1. 23 purposes of this chapter, is referred to as the committee. The committee consists 24 of seven voting members and three ex officio nonvoting members. The seven 25 voting members are the commissioner of veterans' affairs; one person representing 26 each of the American legion, the veterans of foreign wars, the disabled American 27 veterans, the veterans of World War II, Korea, and Vietnam, (amvets), and

- 28 Vietnam veterans of America, incorporated; and one person qualifying as a veteran
- 29 <u>under the provisions of section 37-01-40 but who is not a member of a veterans</u>
- 30 organization. The ex officio nonvoting members are the adjutant general, the

1		center director of the veterans' administration, and the executive director of job
2		service North Dakota.
3	<u>2.</u>	On July 1, 2009, the governor shall appoint five members of the committee. Of the
4		appointments, one member must represent each of the American legion, the
5		veterans of foreign wars, the disabled American veterans, the veterans of World
6		War II, Korea, and Vietnam, (amvets), and Vietnam veterans of America,
7		incorporated. The governor shall make the appointments for the organization
8		representatives from lists of two persons qualifying as veterans under the
9		provisions of section 37-01-40, submitted by each of the nominating organizations.
10		The governor shall appoint on July 1, 2009, on member qualifying as a veteran
11		under the provisions of section 37-01-40 but who is not a member of a veterans'
12		organization. The governor shall appoint two of the members to a term of three
13		years, two of the members to a term of two years, and two of the members to a
14		term of one year, or until their successors are appointed and qualified.
15	<u>3.</u>	On the first day of July in each year, beginning in the year 2010, the governor shall
16		appoint members to fill the expiring term represents the American legion, the
17		veterans of foreign wars, the disabled American veterans, the veterans of World
18		War II, Korea, of Vietnam (amvets), and Vietnam veteran of America, incorporated,
19		the governor shall appoint a member representing the organization with an expiring
20		term from a list of two persons qualifying as a veteran under the provisions of
21		section 37-01-40 submitted by organization.
22	<u>4.</u>	Each appointment beginning in the year 2010 must be for a term of three years, or
23		until a successor is appointed and qualified. All terms begin on the first day of July
24		and end on the thirtieth day of June in the year specified.
25	<u>5.</u>	If a voting member position becomes vacant, the vacancy must be filled for the
26		unexpired portion of the term in the same manner as the initial appointment.
27	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 37-18.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
28	amended and reenacted as follows:	
29	37-18.1-02. Chairman - Secretary - Duties - Terms - Meetings. A chairman and a	
30	secretary of the committee must be appointed by the governor from among the voting	
31	membership of the committee. Such appointment must be made annually, with the term of	

1 office to begin on the first day of July of the year specified and to end on the thirtieth day of 2 June of the following year. The commissioner of veterans affairs is the chairman of the 3 committee. Meetings of the committee must be held upon the call of the chairman, at such 4 times and places as may be selected by the chairman, and upon due notice to committee 5 members by the secretary chairman. Meetings must also be called by the chairman upon the 6 written request of any four voting members of the committee. A majority of the members of the 7 committee is required for a quorum, and a majority of the members present voting in favor 8 thereof is required for any action.

9 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 37-18.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

37-18.1-03. Powers and duties of committee - Creation of subcommittee and
 governing board. The committee is responsible for organization, policy, and general
 administration of all veterans' affairs in the state of North Dakota. It has the following powers
 and duties:

15 1. The chairman and secretary of the committee, acting jointly, shall appoint a 16 seven member governing board for is responsible for the administration of the 17 veterans' home, from within or outside the committee, subject to ratification of a 18 majority vote of the committee, and shall establish term lengths for service on the 19 governing board. The governing board committee has all ordinary powers required 20 of a governing board, including the power to establish gualifications for and 21 selection of an administrator and to establish an appropriate salary structure, 22 subject to limitations of legislative appropriation. The administrator serves at the 23 pleasure of the governing board committee.

24 2. The chairman and secretary of the committee jointly shall appoint a subcommittee 25 to be responsible for supervision and government of the department of veterans' 26 affairs. Once appointed, a subcommittee member may continue to serve as long as the member remains a voting member of the committee, unless removed from 27 28 the subcommittee by joint action of the committee chairman and secretary. A 29 member of the subcommittee may not serve on the governing board of the 30 veterans' home. Each nominating organization listed in section 37-18.1-01 must 31 have at least one voting member nominated by the organization serving on the

1 subcommittee. The subcommittee shall select by majority vote of the members a 2 chairman to preside for the term of one year. 3 3. The committee shall appoint the commissioner of the department of veterans' 4 affairs. The commissioner must be a bona fide resident of the state, and must 5 qualify as a veteran as defined in section 37-01-40. The commissioner serves at 6 the pleasure of the committee. The committee shall determine the salary paid to 7 the commissioner of the department of veterans' affairs within the limits of 8 legislative appropriation. The commissioner of veterans' affairs shall serve as the 9 executive secretary for the subcommittee. The commissioner has no vote in the 10 affairs of the subcommittee. 11 The committee shall, under recommendation from the board or the subcommittee, 4 12 present any matters needing attention and action to the appropriate board, 13 commission, agency, or department of the state, and the North Dakota veterans' 14 coordinating council. 15 5. 3. The committee shall assure compliance with applicable federal and state laws in 16 the administration of both the department of veterans' affairs and the North Dakota 17 veterans' home and shall exercise its responsibilities in all things necessary to 18 carry out the provisions of this chapter in regard to organization, policy, and 19 general administration of the agencies served and involved in the conduct of 20 veterans' affairs. The board governing the veterans' home and the subcommittee 21 governing the department of veterans' affairs committee shall conduct an annual 22 performance evaluation of the administrator and commissioner, respectively, with 23 the evaluation presented to the committee. The board and subcommittee shall and 24 create and implement a strategic plan for the veterans' home and the department 25 of veterans' affairs, respectively. The board and the subcommittee committee 26 annually shall report as to the status of the respective strategic plan to the 27 committee. After receiving a report, the committee shall submit the report to the 28 governor. 29 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 37-18.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is

30 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 37-18.1-04. Committee members not to receive compensation - Expenses 2 permitted. Committee members may not receive any compensation for the performance of 3 their official duties. Voting members may be reimbursed for travel expenses and meals and 4 lodging expenses in connection with their official duties at the same rate and in the same 5 manner as are elected officials and employees of the state, with payment to be made by the 6 department of veterans' affairs and the veterans' home to each of their respective 7 subcommittee members incurring the expenses. The payment must be made by warrant-check 8 drawn by the office of management and budget upon the submission of a proper voucher to it, 9 signed by the commissioner of veterans' affairs or the administrator of the veterans' home, as 10 the case may be. 11 SECTION 9. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS - TRAINING POSITIONS. 12 The commissioner of veterans affairs must utilize two of the department of veterans affairs 13 existing full-time equivalent positions as training officers for the biennium beginning July 1, 14 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. 15 **SECTION 10. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 16 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$20,000, or so much 17 of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of veterans affairs for the purpose of 18 arranging for national association of county veterans service officers accreditation training for all 19 county veterans' service officers in the state for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and 20 ending June 30, 2011.
