## 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

# SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 4-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

- 12 **Commodity groups Agriculture commissioner Meetings.**
- <u>1.</u> The agriculture commissioner may participate, as a nonvoting member, in any
   regular or special meeting of a commodity group, including any executive session
   held by a commodity group.
- 16 <u>2.</u> <u>Annually, the agriculture commissioner shall call a meeting of representatives from</u>
- each commodity group for the purpose of engaging in collaborative efforts to
   promote and market agricultural commodities.
- 19 <u>3.</u> For purposes of this section, "commodity group" means the:
- 20 <u>a.</u> <u>North Dakota barley association;</u>
- 21 <u>b.</u> North Dakota beef commission;
- 22 <u>c.</u> <u>North Dakota beekeepers association;</u>
- 23 <u>d.</u> North Dakota corn utilization council;
- 24 <u>e.</u> North Dakota dairy promotion commission;

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1		f. North Dakota dry bean council;
2		g. North Dakota dry pea and lentil council;
3		h. North Dakota oilseed council;
4		i. North Dakota potato council;
5		j. North Dakota soybean council;
6		k. North Dakota turkey federation; and
7		I. North Dakota wheat commission.
8	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1025 does not not become effective,
9	section 4-1	0.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	4-10	.1-04. North Dakota potato council - Membership - Election - Term.
11	<u>1.</u>	There is hereby established a North Dakota potato council. The council is
12		composed of the agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's designated
13		representative, who is chairman of the council, and one participating grower
14		elected from each of the districts hereinafter established in this chapter. Annually,
15		the members of the council shall elect one from among themselves to serve as the
16		<u>chairman</u> .
17	<u>2.</u>	Every elected council member must be a United States citizen of the state and a
18		bona fide resident of and participating grower in the district that the member
19		represents. The term of each elected member is three years and begins on July
20		first of the year of election, except that initially one member must be elected for a
21		three-year term, two members must be elected for two-year terms, and two
22		members must be elected for one-year terms as designated by the commissioner.
23		An elected member of the council may not serve more than two consecutive
24		three-year terms.
25	<u>3.</u>	If at any time during a member's term that the member ceases to possess any of
26		the qualifications provided for in this chapter, that member's office is deemed
27		vacant and the council shall appoint another qualified participating grower for the
28		remainder of the term of the office vacated.
29	<u>4.</u>	The commissioner shall conduct all elections under this section in each district in
30		such a manner as the commissioner deems determines fair and reasonable. All

2	e	ouncil is eligible to serve more than two consecutive three year terms.

9		director of the agricultural experiment station must be for two years, and the
10		term of the member who is a safflower grower must be for two years.

16		cooperation with the North Dakota state university extension service, shall conduct
17		elections under this section in each district in the manner the commissioner
18		determines fair and reasonable. All elections must be conducted before April first
19		of each year.

21		consecutive three-year terms.

  cooperation with the cooperative extension service, shall conduct all elections

  <u>determines</u> fair and reasonable. Elections must be held before April first of each

 No elected member of the council is eligible to serve more than three consecutive three-year terms.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, section
4-10.4-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

18 4-10.4-03. Council - Membership - Election - Term. The council is composed of one 19 participating grower elected from each of the districts established in section 4-10.4-04. The 20 chairman of the council must be an elected member of the council elected by a majority vote of 21 the council. The commissioner is an ex officio member of the council and does not have a vote. 22 Every elected council member must be a United States citizen of the state and a bona fide 23 resident of and participating grower in the district the member represents. The term of each 24 elected member is three years and begins on April first of the year of election, except that 25 initially two members must be elected for a three-year term; two members must be elected for a 26 two-year term; and one member must be elected for a one-year term as designated by the 27 commissioner. Notwithstanding the terms provided for members elected before August 1, 28 1997, the board, before December 31, 1997, shall determine by lot the order of subsequent 29 elections for its members so that two members are elected for a four-year term during 1998, 30 and one member is elected for a four-year term during each of the subsequent three years. 31 The term of each member elected after July 31, 1997, is four years and begins on April first of

1 the year of election. If at any time during a member's term a member ceases to possess any of 2 the qualifications provided for in this chapter, the member's office is deemed vacant and the 3 remaining members of the council shall appoint another qualified participating grower for the 4 remainder of the term of the office vacated. The commissioner, or a county agent designated 5 by the commissioner, in cooperation with the cooperative extension service, shall conduct all 6 elections under this section in each district in the manner the commissioner <del>deems</del> determines 7 fair and reasonable. All such elections must be completed prior to before expiration of the 8 members' terms. No member serving on the council before August 1, 1997, is eligible to serve 9 more than two consecutive four-year terms. No member elected to the council after July 31, 10 1997, is eligible to serve more than three consecutive four-year terms.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, section
 4-10.5-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

13 4-10.5-02. North Dakota soybean council - Membership - Election - Term. The 14 North Dakota soybean council must be is composed of one participating grower elected from 15 each of the districts established in section 4-10.5-03. The chairman of the council must be a 16 member of the council elected by a majority vote of the council. The commissioner is an 17 ex officio member of the council. Every elected council member must be a resident of and 18 participating grower in the district the member represents. The term of each elected member is 19 three years, beginning on April first of the year of election, except that initially two members 20 must be elected for three-year terms; three members must be elected for two-year terms; and 21 three members must be elected for one-year terms as designated by the commissioner. If at 22 any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess any of the qualifications 23 provided for in this chapter, the member's office is deemed vacant and the council shall, by 24 majority vote, shall appoint another qualified participating grower for the remainder of the term 25 of the office vacated. The commissioner, or a county agent designated by the commissioner, in 26 cooperation with the cooperative extension service, shall conduct all elections under this 27 section in each district in the manner the commissioner determines fair and reasonable. 28 All elections must be conducted no later than April first of each year. No elected member of the 29 council is eligible to serve more than two consecutive three-year terms.

30 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, section
 31 4-10.7-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1 4-10.7-02. Dry pea and lentil council - Membership - Term. There is a North Dakota 2 dry pea and lentil council. The council is composed of one participating grower elected from 3 each of the districts established in section 4-10.7-04. The chairman of the council must be a 4 member of the council elected by a majority vote of the council. The agriculture commissioner 5 is an ex officio member of the council. Every elected member of the council must be a United 6 States citizen of the state and a bona fide resident of and participating grower in the district the 7 member represents. The term of each elected member is three years and begins on April first 8 of the year of election, except that initially one member must be elected for a three-year term; 9 two members must be elected for two-year terms; and two members must be elected for 10 one-year terms as designated by the commissioner. If at any time during a member's term the 11 member ceases to possess any of the qualifications provided for in this chapter, the member's 12 office is deemed vacant and the council, by majority vote, shall appoint another qualified grower 13 from the affected district for the remainder of the term of the office vacated. No elected 14 member of the council is eligible to serve more than three consecutive three-year terms.

SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, section
4-27-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

17 4-27-04. North Dakota dairy promotion commission. There is hereby created a 18 North Dakota dairy promotion commission consisting of nine members. The governor shall 19 appoint two members who must be producers and one member who must be a processor. The 20 governor shall appoint the producer members from a list of nominees supplied by the American 21 dairy association of North Dakota and the processor member from a list of nominees supplied 22 by the North Dakota dairy industries association. Each list of nominees must contain at least 23 twice as many names as the number of appointments to be made therefrom. The term of office 24 of each appointive member of the commission is two years, except that the initial appointment 25 of one producer is for only one year, so that thereafter the term of one producer will expire each 26 year. Terms of office commence on the first day of July. In addition to the three appointive 27 members there must be two ex officio, nonvoting members of the commission who must be the 28 agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's designee and the head The chairman of the 29 department of animal science department or the department's designee sciences at North 30 Dakota state university, or the chairman's designee, is an ex officio nonvoting member. In 31 addition to the appointive and ex officio members there must be four elected members of the

1	commission who must be the president of the American dairy association of North Dakota, the					
2	president of the dairy council of North Dakota, and two members of the milk producers					
3	association	of North Dakota to be elected by that association. The elected members shall meet				
4	with the cor	nmission and shall have the same rights and duties as the appointive members,				
5	including th	e right to vote. The milk producers shall serve terms of two years, commencing on				
6	July first, ex	cept that initially one producer shall serve a term of one year as designated by the				
7	milk produc	ers association of North Dakota.

Council - Membership - Election - Term. 5 The council consists of one individual elected from each district established in 1. 6 section 4.1-02-02 and the commissioner, who is a nonvoting member. 7 2. Each member of the council, other than the commissioner, must be a resident of 8 and a participating producer in the district that the member represents. 9 The term of each elected member is four years and begins on April first. The terms 3. 10 must be staggered so that no more than two terms expire each year. 11 4. If at any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess any of the 12 gualifications provided for in this section, the member's office is deemed vacant 13 and the council, by majority vote, shall appoint another qualified producer for the 14 remainder of the term. 15 5. An elected member of the council may not serve more than three consecutive 16 terms. If an individual is appointed to complete a vacancy, that service is not 17 counted as a term, for purposes of this section, unless the duration of that service 18 exceeds one year. 19 **SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Section 4.1-02-09 of the North Dakota Century Code as 20 created by House Bill No. 1025, as approved by the sixty-first legislative assembly, is amended 21 and reenacted as follows:

4.1-02-09. Council members - Compensation. Each member of the council, except
the commissioner, is entitled to receive compensation in the amount established by the council,
but not exceeding seventy-five dollars per day plus reimbursement for expenses as provided by
law for state officers if the member is attending meetings or performing duties directed by the
council.
