7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-09.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code 9 is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15.1-09.1-01. **Definition.** For purposes of this chapter, "regional education association" means a group of school districts that have entered a joint powers agreement that has been which was reviewed by the superintendent of public instruction and verified as meeting the requirements of section 15.1-09.1-02.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15.1-09.1-02. Regional education association Joint powers agreement Review by superintendent of public instruction - Criteria.
- 18 <u>1.</u> Before a group of school districts may be designated as a regional education
 19 association, the superintendent of public instruction shall review the joint powers
 20 agreement that the districts have entered and verify that: the requirements of this
 21 section have been met.

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Have <u>must have</u> a combined total land mass of at least five <u>six</u> thousand eight hundred square miles [1502193 hectares];

8		the	original joint powers agreement;
9		b. An	application process by which school districts that were not parties to the
10		oriç	ginal joint powers agreement can become participating districts; and
11		c. Ap	process by which school districts that were not parties to the original joint
12		pov	wers agreement and whose application to participate in the agreement was
13		der	nied can appeal the decision to the superintendent of public instruction.
14	6.	The join	t powers agreement provides must provide for the employment and
15		compen	sation of an executive director and other necessary staff.
16	7.	The join	t powers agreement :

20		c. Re	quires all members of the governing board or their designees to be
21		ind	ividuals currently serving on the board of a participating school district; and

25		associat	ion shall meet at least quarterly.
26	9.	The join	t powers agreement does not permit the regional education association to
27		compen	sate members of the regional education association board for attending
28		meeting	s of the board and does not permit the regional education association to
29		reimbure	se members of the board for any expenses incurred in attending meetings
30		of the bo	pard must provide for a governing board that meets the criteria set forth in
31		section :	3 of this Act.

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1 **Board member - Terms - Vacancy.** 2 <u>1.</u> The term of office for board members of a regional education association is three 3 years, except that the terms of initial board members must be staggered by lot so 4 that for a five-member board, no more than two terms expire each year, and for a 5 seven-member or nine-member board, no more than three terms expire each year. 6 2. If a vacancy occurs, the position must be filled in the same manner that the 7 position was filled initially. 8 An individual may not serve more than two consecutive terms. If an individual is 3. 9 appointed or elected to complete a vacancy, that service is not counted for 10 purposes of this section unless the duration of that service exceeds one year. 11 **SECTION 6.** A new section to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 created and enacted as follows: 13 Board member - Compensation. Each member of the board is entitled to receive 14 reimbursement for expenses, as provided by law for state officers, if the member is attending 15 meetings or performing duties directed by the board. 16 **SECTION 7.** A new section to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 17 created and enacted as follows: 18 **Executive director - Qualifications - Compensation.** 19 Beginning no later than January 1, 2010, the board of a regional education 20 association shall employ a full-time executive director. The executive 21 director's qualifications must include a graduate degree from an accredited 22 university, demonstrated competence in an administrative or managerial 23 capacity, and at least five years' experience in education, business, 24 accounting, law, or other profession. 25 The executive director serves at the pleasure of the board. b. 26 The board shall set the compensation of the executive director. The <u>C.</u> 27 executive director's compensation for each year of the 2009-11 biennium may 28 be no lower than eighty-seven thousand three hundred dollars nor higher than 29 one hundred nineteen thousand three hundred dollars.
