- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to powers of the information technology department; and to amend and
- 3 reenact sections 37-17.1-02.1, 54-23.2-01, and 57-40.6-12 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to state radio within the information technology department.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 37-17.1-02.1 is amended:
- 7 **37-17.1-02.1. Department of emergency services.** The department of emergency
- 8 services consists of must have a division of state radio and a division of homeland security.
- 9 The adjutant general is the director of the department. The adjutant general shall provide for
- 10 shared administration of both divisions. The division of homeland security consists of the state
- 11 emergency operations center section, the disaster recovery section, and the homeland security
- 12 section. The adjutant general shall appoint a separate director of each division. A The division
- 13 director serves at the pleasure of the adjutant general. The adjutant general shall fix the
- 14 compensation of a the division director within limits of legislative appropriation.
- 15 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-23.2-01 is amended:
- 16 **54-23.2-01. Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 17 requires:

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- 18 1. "Director" means the director of the division of state radio.
- 19 2. "Division" means the division of state radio of the information technology
- 20 department of emergency services.
- 21 3. "System" means the state radio broadcasting system.
- 22 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 54-59 is created:
- 23 **Division of state radio.** The information technology department must have a division
- 24 of state radio. The chief information officer shall appoint a separate director of the division.

The chief 2 information officer shall fix the compensation of the division director within limits of legislative 3 appropriation. 4 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 57-40.6-12 is amended: 5 57-40.6-12. Emergency services communications coordinating committee -6 Membership - Duties. 7 The governing body of a city or county, which adopted a fee on assessed 8 communications services under this chapter, shall make an annual report of the 9 income, expenditures, and status of its emergency services communication 10 system. The annual report must be submitted to the emergency services 11 communications coordinating committee. The committee is composed of three
  - 2. The committee shall:

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 Recommend to the legislative council changes to the operating standards for emergency services communications, including training or certification standards for dispatchers;

members, one appointed by the North Dakota 911 association, one appointed by

the North Dakota association of counties, and one appointed by the adjutant

general chief information officer to represent the division of state radio.

- b. Develop guidelines regarding the allowable uses of the fee revenue collected under this chapter;
- c. Request, receive, and compile reports from each governing body on the use of the proceeds of the fee imposed under this chapter, analyze the reports with respect to the guidelines, file its report with the legislative council by November first of each even-numbered year regarding the use of the fee revenue, and recommend to the legislative assembly the appropriate maximum fee allowed by section 57-40.6-02; and
- d. Periodically evaluate chapter 57-40.6 and recommend changes to the legislative council.
- The committee may initiate and administer statewide agreements among the governing bodies of the local governmental units with jurisdiction over an emergency 911 telephone system to coordinate the procurement of equipment and

- 1 services, fund the research, administration, and activities of the committee, and
- 2 contract for the necessary staff support for committee activities.
