## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-35-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7	54-35-23. (Effective through July 31, <del>2009</del> <u>2011</u> Committee on tribal and state
8	relations - Membership - Duties.

9	1.	The committee on tribal and state relations is composed of seven members as
10		follows:

11 a. The chairman of the legislative council or the chairman's designee;

- b. Three members of the house of representatives, two of whom must be
  selected by the leader representing the majority faction of the house of
  representatives and one of whom must be selected by the leader representing
  the minority faction of the house of representatives; and
- 16 c. Three members of the senate, two of whom must be selected by the leader
  17 representing the majority faction of the senate and one of whom must be
  18 selected by the leader representing the minority faction of the senate.
- The chairman of the legislative council, or the chairman's designee, shall serve as
   chairman of the committee.
- 3. The committee shall meet at such times and places as determined by the
  chairman. The legislative council shall provide staffing for the committee.
- 4. The committee shall conduct joint meetings with the native American tribal citizens'
  task force to study tribal-state issues, including government-to-government

3		the	the joint meetings have concluded, the committee shall meet to prepare a report on			
4		its fi	ndings	s and recommendations, together with any legislation required to		
5		impl	ement	t those recommendations, to the legislative council.		
6	5.	The members of the committee are entitled to compensation from the legislative				
7		council for attendance at committee meetings at the rate provided for members of				
8		the legislative assembly for attendance at interim committee meetings and are				
9		entit	tled to	reimbursement for expenses incurred in attending the meetings in the		
10		amounts provided by law for other state officers.				
11	6.	a.	The r	native American tribal citizens' task force is composed of six members as		
12			follow	/S:		
13			(1)	The executive director of the Indian affairs commission, or the executive		
14				director's designee;		
15			(2)	The chairman of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe, or the chairman's		
16				designee;		
17			(3)	The chairman of the Spirit Lake <del>Tribe</del> <u>Nation</u> , or the chairman's		
18				designee;		
19			(4)	The chairman of the Three Affiliated Tribes - Mandan, Hidatsa, and		
20				Arikara, or the chairman's designee;		
21			(5)	The chairman of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians, or the		
22				chairman's designee; and		
23			(6)	The chairman of the Sisseton-Wahpeton Sioux Tribe Oyate of the Lake		
24				Travers reservation, or the chairman's designee.		
25		b.	If the	executive director of the Indian affairs commission or any of the tribal		
26		chairmen appoint a designee to serve on the task force, only one individual				
27		may serve as that designee during the biennium. A substitute designee may				
28		be appointed by the executive director of the Indian affairs commission or a				
29			tribal	chairman in the event of the death, incapacity, resignation, or refusal to		
30			serve	e of the initial designee.
