1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 48-10 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to the governor's residence design and construction committee; to

3 amend and reenact section 48-10-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers

4 and duties of the capitol grounds planning commission; and to provide an appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 48-10-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 48-10-03. Powers and duties of the commission - Authority to accept gifts. The 9 capitol grounds planning commission shall confer with the state council on the arts with respect 10 to the artistic value of monuments, memorials, or works of art to be constructed on the capitol 11 grounds and with qualified consultants retained by it to select sites for buildings, facilities, 12 monuments, memorials, or works of art to be constructed on the capitol grounds. The 13 commission shall develop and modify long-term plans for the development of the capitol 14 grounds. The commission shall approve or disapprove the basic style and exterior construction 15 of any building, facility, monument, memorial, or work of art constructed on the capitol grounds. 16 Except as otherwise provided by this section, the commission has exclusive authority to accept 17 or reject gifts of any type or class of property for exterior placement on the capitol grounds or for the improvement of the exterior construction of any building or facility on the capitol grounds. 18 19 No Except as provided in section 2 of this Act, construction or placement of an item on the 20 capitol grounds may not be undertaken without the approval of the commission, unless the 21 construction or placement is authorized by the legislative assembly. If the legislative assembly 22 by law or resolution authorizes the construction or placement of an item on the capitol grounds, 23 the commission shall approve the site, basic style, and exterior construction of the item within a 24 reasonable period of time.

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1 The commission shall advise the director of the office of management and budget and 2 the legislative council on matters relating to the physical and aesthetic features of the interior of 3 all buildings on the capitol grounds. The commission must be called in and shall meet 4 whenever major interior changes, including new construction, remodeling, or renovation of any 5 kind, are proposed or considered for the buildings or facilities on the capitol grounds. The 6 commission must be consulted before the purchase or installation of furniture or fixtures in 7 public areas of the capitol and other buildings on the capitol grounds. The commission shall 8 perform any other duties as may be prescribed by law. 9 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 48-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 10 created and enacted as follows: 11 Governors residence design and construction committee - Powers and duties. 12 The governor's residence design and construction committee consists of the members of the 13 capitol grounds planning commission and four other members selected by the capitol grounds 14 planning commission. The lieutenant governor shall serve as chairman of the commission.

15 <u>The commission shall oversee the design and construction of a new governor's residence to</u>

16 replace the current residence. As part of the design and construction process, the commission

17 may determine whether to preserve or remove the current governor's residence. The

18 commission may do all things necessary to carryout and effect the provisions of this section.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the governor's design and construction committee for the purpose designing and constructing a new governor's mansion in accordance with section 2 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.
