- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 43-32.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to authorizing medical psychologists to prescribe drugs; to amend and reenact
- 3 subsection 27 of section 19-03.1-01, sections 19-03.3-01, 19-03.3-02, 19-03.3-03, 19-03.3-04,
- 4 19-03.3-05, 19-03.3-06, and 19-04-08, subsection 1 of section 43-15-01, section 43-15-31.1,
- 5 subsection 6 of section 43-15.1-01, and section 43-32-32 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 6 relating to prescriptive authority of medical psychologists; and to provide a penalty.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 27 of section 19-03.1-01 of the North Dakota 9 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 27. "Scheduled listed chemical product" means a product that contains ephedrine,
  11 pseudoephedrin pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine, or each of the salts,
  12 optical isomers, and salts of optical isomers of each chemical, and that may be
  13 marketed or distributed in the United States under the Federal Food, Drug, and
  14 Cosmetic Act [21 U.S.C. 301 et seq.] as a nonprescription drug unless prescribed
  15 by a licensed physician or medical psychologist.
  - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 19-03.3-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 19-03.3-01. Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwiserequires:
- "Board" means the state board of medical examiners <u>or North Dakota state board</u>
   of psychologist examiners as appropriate.
- 22 2. "Pain" means acute pain and chronic pain. Acute pain is the normal, predicted 23 physiological response to a noxious chemical or thermal or mechanical stimulus 24 and typically is associated with invasive procedures, trauma, or disease, and is

1		generally time-limited. Chronic pain is a state that persists beyond the usual				
2		course of an acute disease or healing of an injury or that may or may not be				
3		associated with an acute or chronic pathologic process that causes continuous or				
4		intermittent pain over months or years.				
5	3.	"Physician Practitioner" means a physician licensed by the board under chapter				
6		43-17 or a medical psychologist under chapter 43-32.1.				
7	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 19-03.3-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
8	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:				
9	19-0	3.3-02. Prescription or administration of drugs by physician practitioner.				
10	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a physician practitioner may prescribe or administer					
11	controlled substances to a patient in the course of the physician's practitioner's treatment of the					
12	patient for pain. A physician practitioner shall keep records of purchases and disposals of					
13	controlled substances prescribed or administered under this section. The records must include					
14	the date of purchase, the date of sale or administration by the physician practitioner, the name					
15	and address of the patient, and the reason for the prescribing or the administering of the					
16	substances	to the patient.				
17	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 19-03.3-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
18	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:				
19	19-0	3.3-03. Restriction by hospital or health care facility of prescribed drug use				
20	prohibited.	No hospital or health care facility may forbid or restrict the use of controlled				
21	substances	when prescribed or administered by a physician practitioner having staff privileges				
22	at that hosp	ital or health care facility for a patient diagnosed and treated by a physician				
23	practitioner	for pain.				
24	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 19-03.3-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
25	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:				
26	19-0	3.3-04. Disciplinary action for prescribing or administering drug treatment				
27	prohibited.	The board may not discipline a physician practitioner for prescribing or				
28	administerin	ng controlled substances in the course of treatment of a patient for pain under this				
29	chapter.					
30	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 19-03.3-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
31	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:				

1	<b>19-03.3-05. Application.</b> This chapter does not apply to a person an individual being						
2	treated by a physician practitioner for chemical dependency because of the person's						
3	individual's use of controlled substances not related to treatment for pain. This chapter does						
4	not authorize a physician practitioner to prescribe or administer any drug legally classified as a						
5	controlled substance or as an addictive or dangerous drug for other than medically accepted						
6	therapeutic purposes. A person An individual to whom controlled substances are prescribed or						
7	administered for pain is not exempt from section 39-08-01 or 39-20-04.1.						
8	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 19-03.3-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
9	amended and reenacted as follows:						
10	19-03.3-06. Cancellation, revocation, or suspension of physician's practitioner's						
11	license. This chapter does not limit the authority of the board to cancel, revoke, or suspend the						
12	license of any physician practitioner who:						
13	1. Prescribes or administers a drug or treatment that is nontherapeutic in nature or						
4	nontherapeutic in the manner the drug or treatment is administered or prescribed.						
15	2. Fails to keep complete and accurate records of purchases and disposals of						
16	controlled substances listed in chapter 19-03.1.						
7	3. Writes false or fictitious prescriptions for controlled substances scheduled in						
18	chapter 19-03.1.						
19	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 19-04-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
20	amended and reenacted as follows:						
21	19-04-08. Distribution of anabolic steroids prohibited - Exception - Penalty. A						
22	person who distributes or possesses with the intent to distribute an anabolic steroid for any use						
23	in humans other than the treatment of disease under the prescription of a physician practitioner						
24	is guilty of a class B felony.						
25	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 43-15-01 of the North Dakota						
26	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:						
27	1. "Administration" means the direct application of a drug to the body of a patient.						
28	a. The term includes:						
29	(1) The emergency maintenance of a drug delivery device used in home						
30	infusion therapy by a qualified home pharmacist when nursing service						
31	is not available;						

1 (2) Immunization and vaccination by injection of an individual who is more 2 than eighteen years of age, upon an order by a physician, medical 3 psychologist, or nurse practitioner authorized to prescribe such a drug 4 or by written protocol with a physician, medical psychologist, or nurse 5 practitioner; and 6 (3)Provision of drugs by subcutaneous, intradermal, and intramuscular 7 injection to an individual who is more than eighteen years of age upon 8 the order of a physician, medical psychologist, or nurse practitioner 9 authorized to prescribe such a drug. 10 b. The term does not include the regular ongoing delivery of a drug to the patient 11 in a health care setting and other parenteral administration of a drug. 12 **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-15-31.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 43-15-31.1. Patient profile record system. A patient profile record system must be 15 maintained in all pharmacies for persons individuals for whom prescriptions are dispensed. 16 The patient profile record system must be devised so as to enable the immediate retrieval of 17 information necessary to enable the dispensing pharmacist to identify previously dispensed 18 medication at the time a prescription is presented for dispensing. One profile card may be 19 maintained for all members of a family living at the same address and possessing the same 20 family name. 21 The following information must be recorded: 22 The family name and the first name of the person individual for whom the 23 medication is intended, which is the patient. 24 2. The address of the patient. 25 3. An indication of the patient's age group, e.g., infant, child, adult. 26 4. The original date the medication is dispensed pursuant to the receipt of a 27 physician's prescriber's prescription. 28 5. The number or designation identifying the prescription. 29 6. The prescriber's name. 30 7. The name, strength, and quantity of the drug dispensed.

8. The initials of the dispensing pharmacist, and the date of dispensing medication as a renewal (refill) if said initials and such date are not recorded on the back of the original prescription.

The pharmacist shall attempt to ascertain and shall record any allergies and idiosyncrasies of the patient and any chronic conditions which may relate to drug utilization as communicated to the pharmacy by the patient.

Upon receipt of a prescription, a pharmacist must examine the patient's profile record before dispensing the medication to determine the possibility of a harmful drug interaction or reaction. Upon recognizing a potential harmful reaction or interaction, the pharmacist shall take appropriate action to avoid or minimize the problem which shall, if necessary, include consultation with the physician prescriber.

A patient profile record must be maintained for a period of not less than five years from the date of the last entry in the profile record.

**SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 6 of section 43-15.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 6. "Wholesale drug distributor" means any person engaged in the wholesale drug distribution, including manufacturers; repackers; own-label distributors; jobbers; brokers; warehouses, including manufacturers' and distributors' warehouses, chain drug warehouses, and wholesale drug warehouses; independent wholesale drug traders; sales agents; prescription drug repackagers; physicians; dentists; medical psychologists; veterinarians; birth control and other clinics; individuals; hospital pharmacies; nursing home pharmacies or their providers; health maintenance organizations and other health care providers; and retail and hospital pharmacies that conduct wholesale distributions. The term does not include any common carrier or individual hired solely to transport prescription drugs.
- **SECTION 12. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- **43-32-32. Drugs Medicine.** This Except as provided under chapter 43-32.1, this chapter may not be construed as permitting a licensee to administer or prescribe drugs, or in any manner engage in the practice of medicine as defined by the laws of this state.

1	SECTION 13. Chapter 43-32.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and

9	<u>3.</u>	"Controlled substance" has the same meaning as provided under section					
10		<u>19-03.1-01.</u>					
11	<u>4.</u>	"Drug" has the same meaning as provided under section 19-02.1-01.					
12	<u>5.</u>	"Medical psychologist" means a psychologist who holds in good standing a					
13		certificate granting prescriptive authority issued by the board.					
14	<u>6.</u>	"Prescription" means an order for a drug; laboratory test; or any medicine, device,					
15		or treatment, including a controlled substance.					
16	<u>7.</u>	"Prescriptive authority" means the authority to prescribe, administer, discontinue,					
17		or distribute without charge a drug or controlled substance recognized in or					
18		customarily used in the diagnosis, treatment, and management of an individual					
19		with a psychiatric, a mental, a cognitive, a nervous, an emotional, or a behavioral					
20		disorder, or other procedure directly related thereto which is within the scope of the					
21		practice of psychology in accordance with rules adopted by the board.					
22	<u>8.</u>	"Psychologist" has the same meaning as provide under section 43-32-01.					
23	43-32.1-02. Certification. The board shall issue certificates of prescriptive authority.						
24	including developing and implementing procedures for reviewing education and training						
25	credentials for the certification process which are in accordance with the current standards of						
26	professional practice.						
27	43-32.1-03. Qualification. An applicant who applies for a certificate of prescriptive						
28	authority shall demonstrate all of the following by official transcript or other official evidence						
29	satisfactory to the board:						
30	1. The applicant must be a psychologist at the doctoral level who is board-authorized						
31		to provide health care services as a psychologist.

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- 1 the diagnosis, treatment, and management of an individual with a psychiatric, 2 mental, cognitive, nervous, emotional, or behavioral disorder which is relevant to 3 the practice of psychology or to other procedures directly related to the practice of 4 psychology which are within the scope of the practice of psychology in accordance 5 with rules adopted by the board. A psychologist may not issue a prescription unless the psychologist holds a valid 6 7 certificate of prescriptive authority issued under this chapter or the psychologist is 8 acting within the scope of another profession that is authorized to issue a 9 prescription. 10 A prescription issued by a medical psychologist must comply with all applicable <u>3.</u> 11 state and federal laws and regulations and must be identified as written by a 12 medical psychologist in a manner as determined by the board. 13 A medical psychologist shall maintain in a patient's record a record of all the <u>4.</u> 14 patient's prescriptions. 15 5. A medical psychologist may not delegate the authority to prescribe drugs. 16 **43-32.1-06.** Controlled substances - Records. A medical psychologist who is 17 authorized to prescribe a controlled substance shall timely file with the board the medical 18 psychologist's drug enforcement agency registration and the North Dakota state controlled and 19 dangerous substances license number. The board shall maintain current records of every 20 medical psychologist, including the drug enforcement agency registration and number. 21
  - 43-32.1-07. Board powers and duties. The board shall adopt rules relating to denying, modifying, suspending, and revoking the prescriptive authority issued under this chapter or the license issued under chapter 43-32 held by a medical psychologist. The board may require remediation of any deficiencies in the training or practice pattern of a medical psychologist when, in the judgment of the board, the deficiencies could reasonably be expected to jeopardize the health, safety, or welfare of the public.
