4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows:

Searchable database of expenditures.

- 1. By March 1, 2010, the state treasurer shall develop and make publicly available an aggregate and searchable budget database website that includes the following information:
 - <u>a.</u> Each budget unit and political subdivision making expenditures during the previous two fiscal years;
 - b. The name and address of the recipient of each expenditure;
- 14 <u>c.</u> <u>The amount of funds expended;</u>
- d. The source of the funds expended;
- e. A descriptive purpose for the expenditure;
- 17 <u>f. The expected performance outcome for the expenditure;</u>
- 18 <u>g. The performance outcomes achieved for the expenditure;</u>
- h. The result or report of any state audit or review relating to any recipient of
 expenditures or the budget unit, political subdivision, or program; and
- i. Any other information determined relevant by the state treasurer.

1 later than thirty days after the data becomes available to the budget unit or political 2 subdivision. 3 By January first of each even-numbered year, the state treasurer shall add data for <u>3.</u> 4 the previous biennium from each budget unit to the budget database website. 5 By March first of each year, the state treasurer shall add data for the previous fiscal <u>4.</u> 6 year from each political subdivision to the budget database website. 7 The budget database website may not redirect users to any other government 5. 8 website, unless the website has information from all budget units and political 9 subdivisions and each category of information required can be searched 10 electronically by field in a single search. 11 <u>6.</u> The state treasurer shall ensure that all data added to the budget database website 12 remains accessible to the public for a minimum of ten years.
