## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.

1	A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability
2	of prohibiting the use, distribution, and sale of tobacco products in the state.
3	WHEREAS, tobacco use, which harms nearly every organ of the human body, causes
4	more deaths each year than all deaths from human immunodeficiency virus, illegal drug use,
5	alcohol use, motor vehicle injuries, suicides, and murders combined; and
6	WHEREAS, smoking remains the leading preventable cause of death in the United
7	States, resulting in approximately 438,000 deaths annually; and
8	WHEREAS, in North Dakota, 877 adults die prematurely each year from illnesses
9	caused by smoking; and
10	WHEREAS, secondhand smoke kills 80 to 140 North Dakotans each year; and
11	WHEREAS, approximately 11,000 North Dakota youth under the age of 18 are
12	projected to die prematurely due to smoking; and
13	WHEREAS, although North Dakota's smoke-free law covers many businesses and
14	public places, it does not protect employees and visitors in all businesses; and
15	WHEREAS, North Dakota receives less than \$22,000,000 in revenue annually from
16	tobacco taxes, yet pays out \$442,000,000 in direct medical and lost productivity expenditures
17	related to smoking and other tobacco use;
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
19	OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
20	That the Legislative Council study the feasibility and desirability of prohibiting the use,
21	distribution, and sale of tobacco products in the state; and
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and
23	recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
24	the Sixty-second Legislative Assembly.
