- WHEREAS, much still needs to be done to identify the causes of childhood cancer, to
  better understand the biology of childhood cancer, and to evaluate promising anticancer drugs;

  - **WHEREAS**, the fight against childhood cancer forces all of us to examine out faith and fate, to redefine courage and dignity, and to believe in miracles;
