## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study election processes and 2 procedures and the security and integrity of elections in this state, and any possible changes to 3 election laws to ensure the security and integrity of future elections. 4 **WHEREAS**, the security and integrity of elections in the United States has become a 5 growing concern in the wake of election irregularities in a number of states; and 6 **WHEREAS**, the methods through which elections are conducted have changed 7 significantly over the last several years; and 8 WHEREAS, this state has had a long history of honesty in elections and citizens of the 9 state desire that tradition to continue as new election practices and procedures are adopted; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, this state is the only state that does not require voters to register and voters 12 in this state are proud of that tradition; and 13 WHEREAS, since 1997 voters in this state have been allowed to vote by absentee 14 ballot without being required to state a reason for voting by absentee ballot; and 15 WHEREAS, although voters who are unable or unprepared to verify their identity or 16 residence are about to vote by signing an affidavit, the affidavits are rarely verified and the 17 ballots of those voters are counted along with the voters who have proven their eligibility to 18 vote; and 19 WHEREAS, several counties in this state have held mail ballot elections and have 20 reduced the number of polling places in a county to as few as one; and 21 **WHEREAS**, counties have also utilized the ability to establish early voting precincts; 22 and 23 WHEREAS, the integrity of elections is in the best interest of a representative republic 24 and all citizens;
