- 4 to the medical loan repayment program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state department of health, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, as follows:

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1 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO 2 SIXTY-SECOND LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND. The 11 estimated income line item included in section 1 of this Act includes \$272,310, or so much of 12 the sum as may be necessary, to be made available to the state department of health from the 13 environment and rangeland protection fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and 14 ending June 30, 2011. This amount includes \$50,000 for a grant to the North Dakota 15 stockmen's association environmental services program. 16 SECTION 4. INTENT - INDIRECT COST RECOVERIES. Notwithstanding section 17 54-44.1-14, the state department of health may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating 18 account. SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Subsection 5 of section 43-12.2-01 of the North Dakota 19 20 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 21 Each recipient is limited to a ten thirty thousand dollar maximum loan repayment to 22 be paid over two years. 23 The state health council shall may select up to five any number of recipients in five 6. 24 and communities each year as participants in the program subject to the 25 availability of funding. 26 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 43-12.2-03 of the North Dakota 27 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

Shall submit an application to participate in the loan repayment program; and 13 Must have entered into an agreement with a selected community to provide e. 14 full-time services for a minimum of two years at the selected community if the

applicant receives a loan repayment program contract.
