- 1 A BILL for an Act to enact a new section and to amend sections of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code 43-15-25.1 relative to continuing pharmaceutical education for pharmacists.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-15-25.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 43-15-25.1. Continuing pharmaceutical education.

- The legislative assembly makes the following findings and declarations: Each
 pharmacist shall complete at least fifteen hours (1.5 c.e.u.) of approved continuing
 pharmaceutical education every year as a condition of renewal of a certificate of
 licensure as a pharmacist in the state of North Dakota.
- 11a.Because of the continuous introduction of new therapeutic and diagnostic12agents and the changing concepts in the delivery of health care services in13the practice of pharmacy, it is essential that a pharmacist undertake a14continuing education program in order to maintain professional competency15and improve professional skills.
- 16b.To assure the continued competency of the pharmacist and to maintain17uniform qualifications for licensure in the profession for the protection of the18health and welfare of its citizens, the legislative assembly of North Dakota19deems it in the public interest to adopt a continuous professional education20program.
- Commencing March 1, 1987, no No. annual renewal of a license may be issued to
 a pharmacist until such pharmacist has satisfactorily completed an accredited
 program of continuing professional education, all of which may be home self-study,
 during the previous two years year to help assure the pharmacist's continued

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- competence to engage in the practice of pharmacy. The board from time to time
 shall determine the amount of continuing education to be required, not to exceed
 thirty fifteen hours in each biennium annual period. Upon request of the board,
 proof of compliance shall be furnished to the board.
 The board shall adopt rules necessary to carry out the stated objectives and
- 6 purposes and to enforce the provisions of this section, which shall include the
 7 methods of determining accredited programs, methods of determining compliancy,
 8 any fees, and such other rules consistent with this section as the board shall
 9 determine. This section and all rules adopted hereunder shall be uniformly applied
 10 by the board.
