- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to licensing of psychologists; to amend and reenact sections 43-32-01,
- 3 43-32-8.1, 43-32-13, 43-32-17, 43-32-20, 43-32-20.1, and 43-32-27, subsection 1 of section
- 4 43-32-27.1, and section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to licensing of
- 5 psychologists and the practice of psychology; and to repeal section 43-32-19 of the North
- 6 Dakota Century Code, relating to licensing of psychologists.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 9 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 **43-32-01. Definitions.**
- 1. "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.
- "Industrial-organizational psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under
 this chapter to engage in the practice of industrial-organizational psychology.
- "Industrial-organizational psychology" means the provision of psychological
 research services or consultation services to a group or an organization. The term
 does not include the delivery or supervision of services to individuals who are
 themselves, rather than the group or organization, the intended beneficiaries of the
 services, regardless of the source or extent of payment for services rendered.
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 4. <u>"Industrial/organizational psychology resident" means an individual who has met</u>
 20 the requirement of subdivision b of subsection 2 of section 43-32-20, is involved in
- 21 <u>supervised employment in industrial/organizational psychology, and has registered</u> 22 with the board.
- 23 <u>5.]</u>"Licensee" means an industrial-organizational psychologist or a psychologist.

1 5. 6. "Practice of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation, 2 interpretation, or modification of human behavior by the application of 3 psychological principles, methods, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or 4 eliminating symptomatic, maladaptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing 5 interpersonal relationships, work and life adjustment, personal effectiveness, 6 behavioral health, and mental health. The term includes psychological testing and 7 the evaluation or assessment of personal characteristics, such as intelligence, 8 personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and neuropsychological functioning; 9 counseling, psychotherapy, biofeedback, behavior analysis and therapy, clinical 10 applications of hypnosis, and other therapeutic techniques based on psychological 11 principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and emotional disorder or disability, 12 compulsive disorders, substance use disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as 13 well as of the psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or 14 disability; and psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and 15 consultation. The term includes providing psychological services to individuals, 16 families, groups, organizations, institutions, and the public regardless of whether 17 payment is received for services rendered. The term includes supervising others 18 who are engaged in the practice of psychology. 19 "Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the 6. 7. 20 practice of psychology. 7. 8. 21 "Psychology resident" means an individual who has received from a school or 22 college a doctorate degree in a program of study substantially psychological in 23 nature, and who met the requirement of subdivision b of subsection 1 of section 24 43-32-20, is involved in supervised psychological employment, and has registered 25 with the board. 26 8. 9". School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning 27 which is accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time 28 graduate course of study in industrial-organizational psychology or psychology. 29 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 30 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-08.1. Continuing education requirements. The board shall adopt rules
establishing requirements for the continuing education of licensees, psychology residents, and
industrial-organizational psychology residents. The board may refuse to renew, suspend,
revoke, or place on probationary status any license issued under this chapter if the licensee
fails to meet applicable continuing education requirements. Applicants for accreditation of
continuing education courses, classes, or activities may be charged a reasonable fee
determined by the board.

8 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 43-32-13. Annual license and fee. Before January first of each year, every licensee 11 shall pay to the secretary of the board an annual license fee determined by the board not to 12 exceed one hundred fifty dollars. The secretary of the board, upon receipt of payment of the 13 annual license fee, shall issue the licensee a certificate of annual license. An individual may 14 not hold out as an industrial-organizational psychologist or a psychologist until the annual 15 license fee is paid. The board may deny renewal of the license of an individual who violates 16 this section. Annually, the board shall mail a renewal notice to each licensee at the address on 17 file with the board.

18 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19 amended and reenacted as follows:

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43-32-17. License required for practice - Titles.

21 Except as otherwise provided under this chapter, a person may not engage in the 1. 22 practice of psychology or represent that person to be a psychologist in this state 23 unless that person is an individual who is licensed as a psychologist or is 24 registered as a psychology resident under this chapter. Except as otherwise 25 provided by this chapter, a person may not engage in the practice of 26 industrial-organizational psychology or represent that person to be an 27 industrial-organizational psychologist in this state unless that person is an 28 individual who is licensed as a psychologist or an industrial-organizational 29 psychologistor is registered as a psychology resident or industrial-organization 30 psychology resident under this chapter.

1	2.	A psychologist <u>person</u> may <u>not</u> use the title "psychologist" or similar title in	
2		conjunction with the practice of psychology unless that person is licensed as a	
3		psychologist. An industrial-organizational psychologist A person may not use the

9		industrial-organizational psychologist.	
10	<u>3.</u>	A person may not use the title "psychology resident" or similar title unless that	
11		person is registered as a psychology resident. A person may not use the titles	
12		"industrial psychology resident", "organizational psychology resident", or	
13		"industrial-organziational psychology resident" unless that person is registered as a	
14		psychology resident or industrial-organizational psychology resident.

1	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Se	tion 43-32-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:	

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43-32-27. Denial - Revocation or suspension of license - Grounds.

- The board, after notice, hearing, and an affirmative vote of at least a majority of
 board members, may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend any license issued or
 applied for under this chapter and may otherwise discipline a licensee or an
 applicant upon proof the applicant or licensee:
- a. Has been convicted of an offense determined by the board to have a direct
 bearing upon an individual's ability to serve the public as a psychologist or
 industrial-organizational psychologist, or if the board finds, after the conviction
 of any offense, that an individual is not sufficiently rehabilitated under section
 12 12.1-33-02.1.
- 13 Is using any narcotic or alcoholic beverage to an extent or in a manner b. 14 dangerous to the applicant or licensee, any other person, or the public, or to 15 an extent that the use impairs the applicant's or licensee's ability to perform 16 the practice of psychology or industrial-organizational psychology with safety 17 to the public unable to practice psychology with reasonable skill and safety to 18 clients or patients by reason of illness, inebriation, misuse of drugs, narcotics, 19 alcohol, chemicals, or any other substance, or as a result of any mental or 20 physical condition.
- c. Has impersonated another individual holding a psychology or
 industrial-organizational psychology license or allowed another person to use
 the licensee's license.
- 24d.Has used fraud or deception in applying for a license or in taking an25examination under this chapter.
- e. Has allowed the licensee's name or license issued under this chapter to be
 used in connection with any person who performs psychological services
 outside of the area of that person's training, experience, or competence.
- 29f.Is legally adjudicated insane or mentally incompetent. The record of the30adjudication is conclusive evidence of that fact.

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1		g. Has engaged in any form of unethical conduct as defined in ethical principles	
2		of psychologists and code of conduct as adopted and published by of the	
3		American psychological association , 1992, or revised editions if adopted by	
4		the board by rule.	
5		h. Has become grossly negligent in the practice of psychology or	
6		industrial-organizational psychology.	
7		i. Has willfully or negligently violated this chapter.	
8		j. Has engaged in an act in violation of rules adopted by the board.	
9		k. Has had a license revoked or suspended or was disciplined in another	
10		jurisdiction.	
11	2.	An individual whose license has been revoked under this section may not reapply	
12		for licensure after for at least two years have elapsed from after the date of	
13		revocation.	
14	14 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 43-32-27.1 of the North Dakota		
15	Century Co	de is amended and reenacted as follows:	
16	1.	A person aggrieved by the actions of a licensee may file a written complaint with	
17		the board citing the specific allegations of misconduct by the licensee. The board	
18		shall notify the licensee of the complaint and request a written response from the	
19		licensee. The board may establish procedural exceptions for processing multiple	
20		complaints from the same complainant.	
21	SEC	CTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
22	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
23	23 43-32-30. Persons exempt from this chapter. This chapter does not apply to:		
24	1.	Any individual in the employ of any federal, state, county, or municipal agency, or	
25		other political subdivision, or any nonprofit corporation or educational institution	
26		presently chartered by this state, insofar as the activities and services of the	
27		individual are a part of the duties of the person's office or position with such	
28		agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution. This exemption is not available or	
29		effective after July 1, 2001. However, the exemption period may be extended by	
30		the board in individual cases if hardship or other good cause is shown by the	
31		agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution covered, or if the individual affected has	

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1		received from a school or college a master's degree in psychology and the
2		individual's activities and services with such agency, nonprofit corporation, or
3		institution are performed under the supervision of a psychologist. After reviewing
4		the exemption under this subsection, the board and the department of human
5		services shall review their definitions and rules for a master's degree in psychology
6		as used in their own credential requirements.
7	2.	A student or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology or
8		industrial-organizational psychology at a school or college, if the activities and
9		services are a part of the individual's supervised course of study, provided the and
10		are under the supervision of a licensed psychologist or industrial-organizational
11		psychologist. The student or intern does shall not use the title "psychologist" or
12		"industrial-organizational psychologist" and the student or intern status is shall be
13		clearly stated.
14	3. <u>2.</u>	A nonresident licensed or certified in the state of the individual's residence who
15		does not practice psychology or industrial-organizational psychology in this state
16		for a period of more than thirty days in any calendar year.
17	4. <u>3.</u>	A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title
18		when lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not
19		engage in the practice of psychology or industrial-organizational psychology unless
20		the lecturer is licensed under this chapter.
21	5. <u>4.</u>	An individual employed by a public school if that individual's activities and services
22		are restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of
23		employment. This exemption applies only if the individual has received a master's
24		degree in school psychology from an accredited graduate training program.
25		Standards must be established by mutual consent of the board and the
26		superintendent of public instruction.
27	6. <u>5.</u>	A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
28		profession, the or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity,
29		whose scope of practice of which is consistent with the accepted standards of that
30		person's profession. A person claiming an exemption under this subsection may
31		not represent to be rendering psychological services.

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1	7. <u>6.</u>	An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational
2		psychology in another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application
3		in this state, if the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of
4		the applicant's intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the
5		applicant adheres to the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the
6		board.
7	8. <u>7.</u>	A person employed by an agency, a nonprofit corporation, or an institution if that
8		person is currently exempt from licensure. A person exempt under this subsection
9		continues to be exempt if the person continues employment in the same position
10		with the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for and received
11		the exemption.
12	9.	A psychology resident performing services supervised as provided under section
13		4 3-32-20.1.
14	SEC	CTION 11. REPEAL. Section 43-32-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
15	repealed.	

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
