- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-20.4 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the operation of accreditation mills; to amend and reenact section
- 3 15-20.4-02, subsection 3 of section 15-20.4-03, subsection 1 of section 15-20.4-14, section
- 4 15-20.4-06, and subsection 1 of section 15-20.4-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 5 to authorizations to operate postsecondary educational institutions and false academic degrees;
- 6 and to repeal section 15-20.4-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to postsecondary
- 7 educational institution's negotiations of promissory instruments.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-20.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15-20.4-02. Exemptions. The following education and educational institutions are exempted from the provisions of this chapter:
- Institutions exclusively offering instruction at any or all levels from preschool
 through the twelfth grade.
- Education sponsored by a bona fide trade, business, professional, or fraternal
 organization, so recognized by the board, solely for that organization's
 membership, or offered on a no-fee basis.
 - Education solely avocational or recreational in nature, as determined by the board, and institutions offering such education exclusively.
- 4. Certain education provided through short-term programs as determined by theboard.
- 5. Education offered by charitable institutions, organizations, or agencies, so recognized by the board, provided the education is not advertised or promoted as leading toward educational credentials.

Postsecondary educational institutions established, operated, and governed by this 2 or any other state or its political subdivisions, as determined by the board and any 3 educational consortium that includes one or more of the institutions. 4 7. Private four-year institutions chartered or incorporated and operating in the state 5 prior to July 1, 1977, so long as the institutions retain accreditation by national or 6 regional accrediting agencies recognized by the United States office of education. 7 8. Schools of barbering regulated under chapter 43-04. 8 9. Schools of cosmetology regulated under chapter 43-11. 9 10. Schools of nursing regulated under chapter 43-12.1. 10 11. Schools instructing on the manner of conducting games of chance which are 11 regulated under chapter 53-06.1 Native American colleges operating in this state, 12 established by federally recognized Indian tribes. 13 12. Schools instructing on the manner of conducting auction sales which are regulated 14 under chapter 51-05.1. 15 13. Postsecondary educational institutions not operating in this state. 16 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 15-20.4-03 of the North Dakota 17 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 18 Maintain a list of postsecondary educational institutions authorized to operate in 3. 19 this state under the provisions of this chapter. The list must be available for the 20 information of the public and must be sent to the superintendents of all school 21 districts, county superintendents of schools, and guidance counselors certified by 22 the department of public instruction. 23 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 15-20.4-04 of the North Dakota 24 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 25 All postsecondary educational institutions must be accredited by national or 26 regional accrediting agencies recognized by the United States department of 27
 - regional accrediting agencies recognized by the United States department of education. The board may additionally require such further evidence and make such further investigation as in its judgment may be necessary. Any postsecondary educational institution operating in this state seeking its first authorization to operate may be issued a provisional authorization to operate on an annual basis until the institution becomes eligible for accreditation by a recognized

9	<u>1.</u>	Postsecondary educational institutions shall refund tuition and other charges, other	
10		thar	n a reasonable application fee, when written notice of cancellation is given by
11		the student in accordance with the following schedule:	
12	1.	<u>a.</u>	When notice is received prior to, or within seven days after completion of the
13			first day of instruction, or after receipt of the first correspondence lesson by
14			the institution, all tuition and other charges must be refunded to the student.
15	2.	<u>b.</u>	When notice is received prior to, or within thirty days after completion of the
16			first day of instruction, or prior to the completion of one-fourth of the
17			educational services, all tuition and other charges except twenty-five percent
18			thereof must be refunded to the student.
19	3.	<u>C.</u>	When notice is received upon or after completion of one-fourth of the
20			educational services, but prior to the completion of one-half of the educational
21			services, all tuition and other charges except fifty percent thereof must be
22			refunded to the student.
23	4.	<u>d.</u>	When notice is received upon or after the completion of fifty percent of the
24			educational services, no tuition or other charges may be refunded to the
25			student.
26	<u>2.</u>	The	provisions of this section do not prejudice the right of any student to recovery
27		in a	n action against any postsecondary educational institution for breach of
28		contract or fraud.	
29	<u>3.</u>	A postsecondary education institution may implement a refund schedule that	
30		dev	iates from subsection 1 if the proposed refund schedule is more favorable to
31		the	student than the schedule described in subsection 1.

1 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 15-20.4-15 of the North Dakota 2 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 3 It is unlawful for a person to knowingly advertise to sell, issue, or manufacture a 4 false academic degree. A person that violates this subsection is guilty of a class C 5 felony. 6 **SECTION 6.** A new section to chapter 15-20.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 created and enacted as follows: 8 Unlawful to operate accreditation mill - Penalty. 9 A person may not operate an accreditation mill in North Dakota. 1. 10 <u>2.</u> As used in this section: 11 "Accreditation mill" means an accreditation entity that is not recognized by the 12 United States department of education or the state board for career and 13 technical education; 14 To "operate" includes to use a North Dakota address, telephone number, b. 15 facsimile number, or other contact point located in North Dakota. 16 A person that violates this section of a class C felony. 3. 17 SECTION 7. REPEAL. Section 15-20.4-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is 18 repealed.
