- A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-52-03, 15-52-04, and 15-52-31 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the school of medicine and health sciences advisory council.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15-52-03. Medical center School of medicine and health sciences advisory council - Members, terms, meetings.

- To assure the proper coordination and integration of the North Dakota state medical center university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences with all other health and welfare activities of the state, a permanent medical center school of medicine and health sciences advisory council is established to advise, consult, and make recommendations to the university administration, and to the several agencies represented on the council concerning the program of the North Dakota state medical center, the adaptation of the medical center to the needs of the state and to the requirements and facilities of the several agencies involved, and the use of the North Dakota state medical center and its facilities by the various institutions and agencies of the state and its political subdivisions to perform the duties in section 15-52-04.
- 2. The council consists of fourteen members:
 - a. (1) Two members of the senate, one of whom must be from the majority
 party and one of whom must be from the minority party, selected by the
 chairman of the legislative council; and

1 (2) Two members of the house of representatives, one of whom must be 2 from the majority party and one of whom must be from the minority 3 party, to be selected by the chairman of the legislative council; 4 b. One member selected by each of the following: 5 (1) The department of human services; 6 (2) The state board of higher education: 7 (3)The state department of health; 8 (4) The North Dakota medical association; 9 The North Dakota healthcare association; and (5) 10 (6)The veterans administration hospital in Fargo; and 11 One member Four members selected by the dean of the university of North C. 12 Dakota medical school of medicine and health sciences, one from each of the 13 four campus areas of the medical school with headquarters in Bismarck, 14 Fargo, Grand Forks, and Minot. 15 3. The representatives named by the state agencies and boards must be selected to 16 serve as members of the medical eenter advisory council for periods of at least one 17 year, but may not serve longer than their term of office on the public agency. The 18 representatives from the North Dakota state medical association shall and the 19 North Dakota healthcare association serve a term of three years or until their 20 successors are named and qualified. 21 4. The council shall name its own chairman and the dean of the university of North 22 Dakota medical school shall serve as executive secretary of the council. The 23 council shall meet not less than twice each year, and, from time to time, on its own 24 motion or upon request of the university administration, to consider plans and 25 programs of action for the North Dakota state medical center and make its 26 recommendations to the several agencies of the state and political subdivisions 27 involved and to the legislative assembly. 28 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-52-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 29 amended and reenacted as follows: 30 15-52-04. Duties of council. The medical center advisory council shall study. 31 consider, and formulate plans for facilitating and implementing, through the North Dakota state

- 1 medical center, a unified program for the improvement and maintenance of the health of the 2 people of the state in all of its phases. The study must include specifically ways and means of 3 bringing about the complete training of adequate numbers of qualified physicians and surgeons 4 for the people of the state, both in the general practice of medicine and surgery and the field of 5 public health, of allied health professionals, and all other personnel concerned with the 6 improvement and preservation of the health of the people of this state Subject to policies of the 7 state board of higher education, the school of medicine and health sciences advisory council 8 shall advise university of North Dakota officials and the state board of higher education 9 regarding school of medicine and health sciences plans, programs, and facilities. In addition, 10 the advisory council shall, in consultation with the school of medicine and health sciences and 11 other agencies, associations and institutions represented on the advisory council, study and 12 make recommendations regarding school of medicine and health sciences strategic plans, 13 programs and facilities. The advisory council shall biennially submit a report with its 14 recommendations to the entities represented on the advisory council and the legislative council. 15 The report shall include recommendations for implementing strategies, through the school of 16 medicine and health sciences or other or other agencies and institutions, for addressing the 17 health care needs of the people of the state and information regarding the state's healthcare 18 workforce needs. The council may consult with any individual or entity in performing its 19 advisory roles. 20 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-52-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows: 22 15-52-30. Contracts or agreements authorized - Legislative intent. 23
 - 1. The state board of higher education upon the recommendation of the medical center advisory council is hereby authorized to enter into contracts or agreements, both interstate and intrastate, to provide medical education opportunities. These contracts and agreements must be made within the limits of available legislative appropriation and may be for such periods of time as the state board of higher education deems necessary.
 - 2. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the legislative assembly that the state of North Dakota, through its state board of higher education, provide for a

1	comprehensive program of medical education leading to a doctor of medicine
2	degree.
3	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15-52-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amended and reenacted as follows:
5	15-52-31. Admission of students - Qualifications. The faculty of the school of
6	medicine at the university of North Dakota may, with the approval advice of the medical center
7	school of medicine and health sciences advisory council and with the approval of and the state
8	board of higher education, adopt such rules and regulations governing the education and
9	residency qualifications of applicants for admission to the medical school as it deems necessary
10	and proper.
