- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 57-40.6-12 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to membership of the emergency services communication coordinating committee.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 57-40.6-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

6 57-40.6-12. Emergency services communications coordinating committee -

- 7 Membership Duties.
- 8 The governing body of a city or county, which adopted a fee on assessed 1. 9 communications services under this chapter, shall make an annual report of the 10 income, expenditures, and status of its emergency services communication 11 system. The annual report must be submitted to the emergency services 12 communications coordinating committee. The committee is composed of three 13 members, one appointed by the North Dakota 911 association, one appointed by 14 the North Dakota association of counties, and one appointed by the adjutant 15 general to represent the division of state radio.
- 16 2. The committee shall:
- a. Recommend to the legislative council changes to the operating standards for
 emergency services communications, including training or certification
 standards for dispatchers;
- 20 b. Develop guidelines regarding the allowable uses of the fee revenue collected
 21 under this chapter;
- c. Request, receive, and compile reports from each governing body on the use
 of the proceeds of the fee imposed under this chapter, analyze the reports
 with respect to the guidelines, file its report with the legislative council by

1		November first of each even-numbered year regarding the use of the fee
2		revenue, and recommend to the legislative assembly the appropriate
3		maximum fee allowed by section 57-40.6-02; and
4		d. Periodically evaluate chapter 57-40.6 and recommend changes to the
5		legislative council.
6	<u>e.</u>	Serve as the governmental body for coordinating plans and implementing E-911
7		services and internet protocol (IP) enabled emergency networks.
8	3.	The committee may initiate and administer statewide agreements among the
9		governing bodies of the local governmental units with jurisdiction over an
10		emergency 911 telephone system to coordinate the procurement of equipment and
11		services, fund the research, administration, and activities of the committee, and
12		contract for the necessary staff support for committee activities.
