## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4016

1 A concurrent resolution urging the Congress of the United States and the President to enact 2 federal legislation promoting travel to the United States by overseas visitors, thereby promoting 3 the economies of communities across North Dakota and the United States. WHEREAS, travel and tourism generates \$1.7 trillion in economic activity in the United 4 5 States every year; and 6 **WHEREAS**, travel and tourism is a powerful economic generator for North Dakota, 7 accounting for \$3.8 billion in visitor spending in the state in 2006; and 8 WHEREAS, travel and tourism promote job creation in North Dakota with as many as 9 30,240 jobs related to travel and tourism economic activity, 8.6 percent of total employment in 10 the state; and 11 WHEREAS, since the security changes after 9/11 were implemented, a perception grew 12 overseas that the United States is no longer a friendly and welcoming destination; and 13 WHEREAS, travel to the United States from overseas destinations has yet to rebound 14 to pre-9/11 levels; and 15 **WHEREAS**, the perception of the United States as having an unwelcome entry process 16 has cost the United States \$150 billion in lost visitor spending and 250,000 American jobs, 17 losses that affect every state in the Union; and 18 WHEREAS, tourism promotes diplomacy as overseas visitors are more likely to have a 19 favorable opinion of the United States after having visited; and 20 WHEREAS, despite travel and tourism's positive impact across the United States 21 economy, the federal government has failed to promote travel and tourism as a means to 22 increase economic growth; and 23 WHEREAS, all major industrialized nations except the United States have national 24 tourism policies and spend significant funds on promoting their destinations overseas, and, in 25 turn, see substantial returns on their investments; and

- 1 WHEREAS, communities across the state work to promote travel and would benefit
- 2 from a federal promotion; and
- 3 **WHEREAS**, the Travel Promotion Act would benefit North Dakota and every state,

4 create jobs, explain national security procedures, and improve our national image around the5 world;

## 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE

## 7 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

- 8 That the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States and
- 9 the President to enact federal legislation promoting travel to the United States by overseas

10 visitors, thereby promoting the economies of communities across North Dakota and the United

- 11 States; and
- 12 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
- 13 resolution to the President and to each member of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation.
