BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4	SECTION 1. STUDY - RATE STRUCTURE OF DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY
5	PROVIDERS. During the 2009-10 interim, th department of human services shall contract wit a
6	qualified independent contractor to study the methodology and calculations for the rate setting
7	structure used by the department to reimburse private, licensed developmental disability
8	providers service ICF/MR medically fragile and behaviorally challenged individuals that meet
9	the definitions established by the Oregon scoring criteria used by the department to assess
10	levels of medical and behavioral severity in children and other recognized scoring criteria used
11	to score adult severity. The study must address reimbursement adequacy, equitabilty and
12	fairness or reimbursement rates among such providers, the level of medical and supportive
13	services required by providers to adequately serve individuals in those categories, the varying
14	levels of medical and behavioral complexity of individuals requiring services by the providers
15	and any other analytical comparison bearing upon issues of reimbursement adequacy, fairness
16	and equitability to such providers. In obtaining data and arriving at outcomes and
17	recommendations, the study shall consult with those providers furnishing services to such
18	individuals. Before July 1, 2010, the department shall report the outcomes and
19	recommendations of this study to the legislative council.
20	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the

general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$100,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of conducting the study required in section 1 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.
