- 2 Century Code, relating to meetings of commodity groups; and to amend and reenact sections
- 3 4-10.1-05, 4-10.2-03, 4-10.3-03, 4-10.4-03, 4-10.5-02, 4-10.7-02, and 4-27-04 of the North
- 4 Dakota Century Code, relating to removal of the agriculture commissioner from commodity
- 5 groups.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 4-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
created and enacted as follows:

9	<u>Co</u>	mmodity groups - Agriculture commissioner - Meetings.
10	<u>1.</u>	The agriculture commissioner may participate, as a nonvoting member, an any
11		regular or special meetings of a commodity group, including any executive session
12		held by a commodity group.
13	<u>2.</u>	Annually, the agriculture commissioner shall call a meeting of representatives from
14		each commodity group for the purpose of engaging in collaborative efforts to
15		promote and market agricultural commodities.
16	<u>3.</u>	For purposes of this section, "commodity group" means the:
17		a. North Dakota barley association;
18		b. North Dakota beef commission;
19		c. North Dakota beekeepers association;
20		d. North Dakota corn utilization council;
21		e. North Dakota dairy promotion commission;
22		f. North Dakota dry bean council;
23		g. North Dakota dry pea and lentil council;
24		h. North Dakota oilseed council;

1		i. North Dakota potato council;			
2		j. North Dakota soybean council;			
3		k. North Dakota turkey federation council; and			
4		I. North Dakota wheat commission.			
5	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
6	6 amended and reenacted as follows:				
7	4-10	0.1-04. North Dakota potato council - Membership - Election - Term.			
8	<u>1.</u>	There is hereby established a North Dakota potato council. The council is			
9		composed of the agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's designated			
10		representative, who is chairman of the council, and one participating grower			
11		elected from each of the districts hereinafter established in this chapter. Annually,			
12		the members of the council shall elect one from among themselves to serve as the			
13		chairman.			
14	<u>2.</u>	Every elected council member must be a <u>United States</u> citizen <del>of the state</del> and a			
15		bona fide resident of and participating grower in the district ?that member?			
16		represents. The term of each elected member is three years and begins on July			
17		first of the year of election, except that initially one member must be elected for a			
18		three-year term, two members must be elected for two-year terms, and two			
19		members must be elected for one-year terms as designated by the commissioner.			
20		An elected member of the council may not serve more than two consecutive			
21		three-year terms.			
22	<u>3.</u>	If at any time during a member's term ?that member? ceases to possess any of			
23		the qualifications provided for in this chapter, ?that member's? office is deemed			
24		vacant and the council shall appoint another qualified participating grower for the			
25		remainder of the term of the office vacated.			
26	<u>4.</u>	The commissioner shall conduct all elections under this section in each district in			
27		such a manner ?as the commissioner? deems to be fair and reasonable. All such			
28		elections must be conducted in the month of June. No elected member of the			
29		council is eligible to serve more than two consecutive three year terms.			
30	30 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.2-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
31	31 amended and reenacted as follows:

2	1.	The	e North Dakota oilseed council is composed of:
3		a.	One participating sunflower grower elected from each of the districts
4			established in section 4-10.2-04;
5		b.	One participating canola grower elected from each of the districts established
6			in section 4-10.2-04.1;
7		C.	One participating safflower grower appointed by the governor;
8		d.	One participating crambe grower appointed by the governor;
9		e.	One participating flax grower appointed by the governor; and
10		f.	One member appointed by the director of the agricultural experiment station.
11	2.	The	e chairman of the council must be a member of the council elected by a majority
12		vot	e of the council. The commissioner is an ex officio member of the council.
13	3.	a.	Every elected and appointed council member must be United States a citizen
14			of the state.
15		b.	The elected member who is a sunflower grower must be a bona fide resident
16			of and participating sunflower grower in the district the member represents.
17		C.	The elected member who is a canola grower must be a bona fide resident of
18			and participating canola grower in the district the member represents.
19	4.	a.	The term of each elected member who is a sunflower grower is three years
20			and begins on April first of the year of election, except that initially two
21			members must be elected for a three-year term; two members must be
22			elected for a two-year term; and two members must be elected for a one-year
23			term as designated by the commissioner.
24		b.	The term of each elected member who is a canola grower is three years and
25			begins on April first of the year of election, except that initially one member
26			must be elected for a three-year term; one member must be elected for a
27			two-year term; and one member must be elected for a one-year term as
28			designated by the commissioner.
29		C.	The term of the elected member who is a sunflower grower from district seven
30			must coincide with the term of the elected member who is a sunflower grower
31			from district six.

1		d. The term of each appointed member is three years and begins on April first of
2		the year of the appointment. Initially, the term of the member who is a flax
3		grower must be for three years, the term of the member appointed by the
4		director of the agricultural experiment station must be for two years, and the
5		term of the member who is a safflower grower must be for two years.
6	5.	If at any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess any of the
7		qualifications provided for in this chapter, the member's office is deemed vacant
8		and the remaining members of the council shall appoint another qualified
9		participating grower for the remainder of the vacated term.
10	6.	The commissioner, or a county agent designated by the commissioner, in
11		cooperation with the North Dakota state university extension service, shall conduct
12		elections under this section in each district in the manner the commissioner
13		determines fair and reasonable. All elections must be conducted before April first
14		of each year.
15	7.	No elected or appointed member of the council is eligible to serve more than four
16		consecutive three-year terms.
17	SE	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.3-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
18	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
19	4-1	0.3-03. North Dakota dry bean council - Membership - Election - Term.
20	1.	The North Dakota dry bean council is composed of one participating grower
21		elected from each of the districts established in section 4-10.3-04. The chairman
22		of the council must be a member of the council elected by a majority vote of the
23		council. The agriculture commissioner is an ex officio member of the council.
24	2.	Every elected council member must be a United States citizen of the state and a
25		bona fide resident of and participating grower in the district the member represents.
26	3.	The term of each elected member is three years and begins on April first of the
27		year of election, except that initially one member must be elected for a three-year
28		term; two members must be elected for two-year terms; and two members must be
29		elected for one-year terms as designated by the commissioner.
30	4.	If at any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess any of the
31		qualifications provided for in this chapter, the member's office is deemed vacant

1 and the council shall, by majority vote, appoint another qualified participating 2 grower for the remainder of the term of the office vacated. 3 5. The commissioner, or a county agent designated by the commissioner, in 4 cooperation with the cooperative extension service, shall conduct all elections 5 under this section in each district in the manner the commissioner deems fair and 6 reasonable. Elections must be held before April first of each year. 7 6. No elected member of the council is eligible to serve more than three consecutive 8 three-year terms.

9 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.4-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11 4-10.4-03. Council - Membership - Election - Term. The council is composed of one 12 participating grower elected from each of the districts established in section 4-10.4-04. The 13 chairman of the council must be an elected member of the council elected by a majority vote of 14 the council. The commissioner is an ex officio member of the council and does not have a vote. 15 Every elected council member must be a citizen of the state United States and a bona fide 16 resident of and participating grower in the district the member represents. The term of each 17 elected member is three years and begins on April first of the year of election, except that 18 initially two members must be elected for a three-year term; two members must be elected for a 19 two-year term; and one member must be elected for a one-year term as designated by the 20 commissioner. Notwithstanding the terms provided for members elected before August 1, 21 1997, the board, before December 31, 1997, shall determine by lot the order of subsequent 22 elections for its members so that two members are elected for a four-year term during 1998, 23 and one member is elected for a four-year term during each of the subsequent three years. 24 The term of each member elected after July 31, 1997, is four years and begins on April first of 25 the year of election. If at any time during a member's term a member ceases to possess any of 26 the qualifications provided for in this chapter, the member's office is vacant and the remaining 27 members of the council shall appoint another qualified participating grower for the remainder of 28 the term of the office vacated. The commissioner, or a county agent designated by the 29 commissioner, in cooperation with the cooperative extension service, shall conduct all elections 30 under this section in each district in the manner the commissioner deems fair and reasonable. 31 All such elections must be completed prior to expiration of the members' terms. No member

serving on the council before August 1, 1997, is eligible to serve more than two consecutive
 four-year terms. No member elected to the council after July 31, 1997, is eligible to serve more
 than three consecutive four-year terms.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.5-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 4-10.5-02. North Dakota soybean council - Membership - Election - Term. The 7 North Dakota soybean council must be composed of one participating grower elected from each 8 of the districts established in section 4-10.5-03. The chairman of the council must be a member 9 of the council elected by a majority vote of the council. The commissioner is an ex officio 10 member of the council. Every elected council member must be a resident of and participating 11 grower in the district the member represents. The term of each elected member is three years, 12 beginning on April first of the year of election, except that initially two members must be elected 13 for three-year terms; three members must be elected for two-year terms; and three members 14 must be elected for one-year terms as designated by the commissioner. If at any time during a 15 member's term the member ceases to possess any of the qualifications provided for in this 16 chapter, the member's office is deemed vacant and the council shall, by majority vote, appoint 17 another qualified participating grower for the remainder of the term of the office vacated. The 18 commissioner, or a county agent designated by the commissioner, in cooperation with the 19 cooperative extension service, shall conduct all elections under this section in each district in 20 the manner the commissioner deems fair and reasonable. All elections must be conducted no 21 later than April first of each year. No elected member of the council is eligible to serve more 22 than two consecutive three-year terms.

23 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.7-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 24 amended and reenacted as follows:

4-10.7-02. Dry pea and lentil council - Membership - Term. There is a North Dakota
dry pea and lentil council. The council is composed of one participating grower elected from
each of the districts established in section 4-10.7-04. The chairman of the council must be a
member of the council elected by a majority vote of the council. The agriculture commissioner
is an ex officio member of the council. Every elected member of the council must be a citizen of
the state and a bona fide resident of and participating grower in the district the member
represents. The term of each elected member is three years and begins on April first of the

year of election, except that initially one member must be elected for a three-year term; two members must be elected for two-year terms; and two members must be elected for one-year terms as designated by the commissioner. If at any time during a member's term the member ceases to possess any of the qualifications provided for in this chapter, the member's office is deemed vacant and the council, by majority vote, shall appoint another qualified grower from the affected district for the remainder of the term of the office vacated. No elected member of the council is eligible to serve more than three consecutive three-year terms.

8 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4-27-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 4-27-04. North Dakota dairy promotion commission. There is hereby created a 11 North Dakota dairy promotion commission consisting of nine members. The governor shall 12 appoint two members who must be producers and one member who must be a processor. The 13 governor shall appoint the producer members from a list of nominees supplied by the American 14 dairy association of North Dakota and the processor member from a list of nominees supplied 15 by the North Dakota dairy industries association. Each list of nominees must contain at least 16 twice as many names as the number of appointments to be made therefrom. The term of office 17 of each appointive member of the commission is two years, except that the initial appointment 18 of one producer is for only one year, so that thereafter the term of one producer will expire each 19 year. Terms of office commence on the first day of July. In addition to the three appointive 20 members there must be two ex officio, nonvoting members of the commission who must be the 21 agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's designee and the head. The chairman of the 22 department of animal science department or the department's designee sciences at North 23 Dakota state university, or the chairman's designee, is an ex officio nonvoting member. In 24 addition to the appointive and ex officio members there must be four elected members of the 25 commission who must be the president of the American dairy association of North Dakota, the 26 president of the dairy council of North Dakota, and two members of the milk producers 27 association of North Dakota to be elected by that association. The elected members shall meet 28 with the commission and shall have the same rights and duties as the appointive members, 29 including the right to vote. The milk producers shall serve terms of two years, commencing on 30 July first, except that initially one producer shall serve a term of one year as designated by the 31 milk producers association of North Dakota.
