1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact five new sections to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North

2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the governing boards and executive directors of regional

3 education associations; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-09.1-01 and 15.1-09.1-02 of the

4 North Dakota Century Code, relating to regional education associations; and to repeal section

5 15.1-09.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to compensation of board members for

6 extraordinary service.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-09.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code 9 is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-09.1-01. Definition. For purposes of this chapter, "regional education
 association" means a group of school districts that have entered a joint powers agreement that
 has been which was reviewed by the superintendent of public instruction and verified as
 meeting the requirements of section 15.1-09.1-02.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code
is amended and reenacted as follows:

16 **15.1-09.1-02.** Regional education association - Joint powers agreement - Review

17 by superintendent of public instruction - Criteria. Before a group of school districts may be

18 designated as a regional education association, the superintendent of public instruction shall

19 review the joint powers agreement that the districts have entered and verify that: the

20 requirements of this section have been met.

21 1. The school districts:

a. Have <u>must have</u> a combined total land mass of at least five <u>six</u> thousand cight
 hundred square miles [1502193 hectares];

	education asso	ne consolidation of South Central and South East, each regional ciation except Mid-Dakota consists of at least 6,000 square miles. Each ion association except Mid-Dakota consists of at least 15 districts. If the

regional education association except Mid-Dakota consists of at least 15 districts. If the requirement for a minimum number of school districts is left in, there could be a problem if school districts within a regional education association consolidate and the regional education association no longer meets the threshold of 12 districts.

The school districts are must be contiguous to each other or, if the districts are not 12 contiguous to each other, the superintendent of public instruction shall verify that 13 the participating districts can provide sound educational opportunities to their 14 students in a fiscally responsible manner without injuring other school districts or 15 regional education associations and without negatively impacting the ability of 16 other school districts or regional education associations to provide sound 17 educational opportunities to their students in a fiscally responsible manner. A 18 decision by the superintendent of public instruction under this subsection may be 19 appealed to the state board of public school education. A decision by the state 20 board is final. 21 3. The joint powers agreement requires must require that the participating school 22 districts maintain a joint operating fund and share various administrative functions 23 and student services in accordance with subsection 4.

9		e. For purposes of this subsection, if a regional education association became
10		operational before July 1, 2005, the 2005-06 school year must be considered
11		the provider's first year of operation.
12	5.	The joint powers agreement provides must establish:
13		a. Criteria for the future participation of school districts that were not parties to
14		the original joint powers agreement;
15		b. An application process by which school districts that were not parties to the
16		original joint powers agreement can become participating districts; and
17		c. A process by which school districts that were not parties to the original joint
18		powers agreement and whose application to participate in the agreement was
19		denied can appeal the decision to the superintendent of public instruction.
20	6.	The joint powers agreement provides must provide for the employment and
21		compensation of an executive director and other necessary staff.
22	7.	The joint powers agreement:
23		a. Establishes the number of members on the governing board;
24		b. Establishes the manner in which members of the governing board are
25		determined;
26		c. Requires all members of the governing board or their designees to be
27		individuals currently serving on the board of a participating school district; and
28		d. Allows for the inclusion of ex officio nonvoting members on the governing
29		board.
30	8.	The joint powers agreement provides that the board of the regional education
31		association shall meet at least quarterly.

- 28 Chairman - Meetings.

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1	<u>1.</u>	Annually, the board of a regional education association shall elect one member to		
2		serve as the chairman.		
3	<u>2.</u>	The chairman shall call meetings of the board and shall call a special meeting of		
4		the board within seven days, when petitioned to do so by two members in the case		
5		of a five-member board, three members in the case of a seven-member board, or		
6		four members in the case of a nine-member board.		
7	<u>3.</u>	The board shall meet at least quarterly.		
8	SEC	CTION 5. A new section to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
9	created and enacted as follows:			
10	Boa	Board member - Terms - Vacancy.		
11	<u>1.</u>	The term of office for board members of a regional education association is three		
12		years, except that the terms of initial board members must be staggered by lot so		
13		that for a five-member board, no more than two terms expire each year, and for a		
14		seven-member or nine-member board, no more than three terms expire each year.		
15	<u>2.</u>	If a vacancy occurs, the position must be filled in the same manner that the		
16		position was filled initially.		
17	<u>3.</u>	An individual may not serve more than two consecutive terms. If an individual is		
18		appointed or elected to complete a vacancy, that service is not counted for		
19		purposes of this section unless the duration of that service exceeds one year.		
20	SEC	CTION 6. A new section to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
21	created and enacted as follows:			
22	Boa	rd member - Compensation. Each member of the board is entitled to receive		
23	reimbursement for expenses, as provided by law for state officers, if the member is attending			
24	meetings or	performing duties directed by the board.		

NOTE: Because they are public employees, superintendents should not receive a per diem in addition to their regular salary. Current law does not allow school board members to be compensated by a regional education association. However, if a superintendent or a school board member is incurring expenses to travel to regional education association board meetings, especially since the individual would be representing more than just his or her respective district or board, it seems appropriate to have the regional education association cover travel expenses. This also addresses the reimbursement of expenses incurred for services above and beyond the norm. (see Section 15.1-09.1-09)

25 SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is

26 created and enacted as follows:

1	Exe	cutive director - Qualifications - Compensation.
2	<u>1.</u>	a. Beginning no later than January 1, 2010, the board of a regional education
3		association shall employ a full-time executive director. The executive
4		director's qualifications must include a graduate degree from an accredited
5		university, demonstrated competence in an administrative or managerial
6		capacity, and at least five years' experience in education, business,
7		accounting, law, or other profession.
8		b. The executive director serves at the pleasure of the board.
9		c. The board shall set the compensation of the executive director. The
10		executive director's compensation for each year of the 2009-11 biennium may
11		be no lower than eighty-seven thousand three hundred dollars nor higher than
12		one hundred nineteen thousand three hundred dollars.
13	<u>2.</u>	The board may employ an individual to serve as an acting director between July 1,
14		2009, and the date on which the executive director commences employment.
15		Notwithstanding subsection 1, the board may determine the qualifications, duties,
16		and compensation of an acting director.

NOTE: The compensation is based on the 2006-07 range of average total compensation for administrators (assistant directors, directors, assistant principals, principals, assistant superintendents, and superintendents) among the following school districts: Bismarck, Dickinson, Fargo, Grand Forks, Jamestown, Minot, West Fargo, and Williston.

17 SECTION 8. REPEAL. Section 15.1-09.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

18 repealed.

NOTE: Section 15.1-09.1-09 provides that:

The board of a regional education association may provide compensation and reimbursement to any board member who, at the direction of the board, performs extraordinary service on behalf of the board. For purposes of this section, "extraordinary service" means duties beyond those reasonably expected of members of the board and includes travel to and attendance at national meetings or conventions.

This concept was addressed in Section 6 above. However, Section 15.1-09.1-09 (current law) allows for compensation and reimbursement of expenses. The proposed language in Section 6 allows just reimbursements of expenses and not compensation.
