6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:
7	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code
8	is amended and reenacted as follows:
9	15.1-09.1-01. Definition. For purposes of this chapter, "regional education
10	association" means a group of school districts that have entered a joint powers agreement that
11	has been which was reviewed by the superintendent of public instruction and verified as
12	meeting the requirements of section 15.1-09.1-02.
13	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code
14	is amended and reenacted as follows:
15	15.1-09.1-02. Regional education association - Joint powers agreement - Review
16	by superintendent of public instruction - Criteria. Before a group of school districts may be
17	designated as a regional education association, the superintendent of public instruction shall
18	review the joint powers agreement that the districts have entered and verify that: the
19	requirements of this section have been met.
20	1. The school districts:
21	a. Have must have a combined total land mass of at least five six thousand eight
22	hundred square miles [1502193 hectares];
23	b. (1) Have a combined total land mass of at least four thousand five hundred

23		Boa	d member - Terms - Vacancy.	
24		<u>1.</u>	The term of office for board members of a regional education association is the	ree
25			years, except that the terms of initial board members must be staggered by lot	<u>so</u>
26			that for a five-member board, no more than two terms expire each year, and fo	<u>or a</u>
27			seven-member or nine-member board, no more than three terms expire each	year.
28		<u>2.</u>	If a vacancy occurs, the position must be filled in the same manner that the	
29			position was filled initially.	

1	<u>3.</u>	An individual may not serve more than two consecutive terms. If an individual is
2		appointed or elected to complete a vacancy, that service is not counted for
3		purposes of this section unless the duration of that service exceeds one year.
4	SEC	CTION 6. A new section to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	created and	d enacted as follows:
6	Воа	ard member - Compensation. Each member of the board is entitled to receive
7	compensat	ion in the amount established by the board but not exceeding one hundred dollars
8	per day plu	s reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers if the member is
9	attending m	neetings or performing duties directed by the board. The compensation provided for
10	in this secti	on may not be paid to any member of the board who receives a salary or other
11	compensat	ion as an employee or official of this state.
12	SEC	CTION 7. REPEAL. Section 15.1-09.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
13	repealed.
