- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-27-07.2 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to the determination of baseline funding for districts receiving federal impact aid;
- 3 and to declare an emergency.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-27-07.2 of the North Dakota Century Code 6 is amended and reenacted as follows:

31			allov	vable growth in the baseline funding per weighted student unit provided in				

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1	subdivision a must be annually increased by three percentage points, plus the
2	district's share of any increased state aid for that year. Payments received by
3	districts for the provision of full-day kindergarten do not constitute increases in
4	state aid for purposes of this subdivision.
5	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
