1 A BILL for an Act to provide individuals having medical conditions reasonable restroom access

2 in retail establishments; and to provide a penalty.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. <u>Restroom access - Penalty.</u>

5 <u>1.</u> <u>As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires:</u>

- a. "Customer" means an individual who is lawfully on the premises of a retail
  establishment.
- b. "Eligible medical condition" means Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, any
   other inflammatory bowel disease, inflammatory bowel syndrome, or any
   other medical condition that requires immediate access to a toilet facility. The
   term includes use of an ostomy device.
- 12c."Retail establishment" means a place of business open to the general public13for the sale of goods or services. The term does not include a filling station or14service station with a structure of eight hundred square feet or less which has15an employee toilet facility located within that structure.
- 162.A retail establishment that has a toilet facility for the establishment's employees17shall allow a customer to use that employee toilet facility during normal business18hours if the employee toilet facility is reasonably safe and all of the following19conditions are met:
- 20a.The customer requesting the use of the employee toilet facility suffers from an21eligible medical condition;
- 22b.Three or more employees of the retail establishment are working at the time23the customer requests use of the employee toilet facility;

1		c. The retail establishment does not normally make a restroom available to the
2		public;
3		d. The employee toilet facility is located in an area where providing access
4		would not create an obvious health or safety risk to the customer or an
5		obvious security risk to the establishment; and
6		e. A public restroom is not immediately accessible to the customer.
7	<u>3.</u>	A retail establishment or an employee of a retail establishment is not civilly liable
8		for any act or omission in allowing a customer who claims to have an eligible
9		medical condition to use an employee toilet facility that is not a public restroom if
10		the act or omission:
11		a. Is not willful or grossly negligent;
12		b. Occurs in an area of the retail establishment which is not accessible to the
13		public; and
14		c. Results in an injury to or death of the customer or any individual other than an
15		employee accompanying the customer.
16	<u>4.</u>	This section does not require a retail establishment to make any physical changes
17		to an employee toilet facility.
18	<u>5.</u>	A retail establishment or an employee of a retail establishment which violates this
19		section is guilty of an infraction. The fine for a first offense may not exceed fifty
20		dollars.
