- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-36-01 and 54-36-03 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the members and the powers and duties of the indian affairs
- 3 commission.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-36-01 is amended:
- 6 **54-36-01. Commission Members Officers Expenses of members.** The North
- 7 Dakota Indian affairs commission consists of the governor, three members appointed by the
- 8 governor from the state at large, two of whom must be of Indian descent, must be enrolled
- 9 members of a tribe, and must be current voting residents of the state of North Dakota, and the
- 10 chairperson, or the chairperson's designee, of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe; the Spirit Lake
- 11 Tribe Dakotah Nation; the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation Mandan,
- 12 Hidatsa, and Arikara Nation; the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians; and the
- 13 Sisseton-Wahpeton Oyate of the Lake Traverse Reservation. The governor is the chairperson
- 14 of the commission. The commission shall meet quarterly or as otherwise agreed. Members of
- 15 the commission or the chairperson's designee are entitled to receive mileage and expenses for
- 16 attending each meeting as are allowed other state officers.
- 17 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-36-03 is amended:
- 18 **54-36-03. Powers and duties.** The Indian affairs commission shall have the power to
- 19 may assist and to mobilize the support of state and federal agencies in assisting Indian
- 20 individuals and groups in North Dakota, especially the five tribal councils, as they the Indian
- 21 <u>individuals and tribal councils</u> seek to develop their own goals, project plans for achieving those
- 22 goals, and implement implementation of those plans. The indian affairs commission may
- 23 accept gifts, grants, donations, legacies, and devises from any source which are appropriated
- 24 for the purposes of the commission. The commission's duties are to:

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- To investigate Investigate any phase of Indian affairs and to assemble and make
   available the facts needed by tribal, state, and federal agencies to work effectively
   together.
  - 2. To assist Assist tribal, state, and federal agencies in developing programs whereby Indian citizens may achieve more adequate standards of living.
    - To assist Assist tribal groups in developing increasingly effective institutions of self-government.
  - 4. To work Work for greater understanding and improved relationships between Indians and non-Indians.
  - 5. To seek Seek increased participation by Indian citizens in local and state affairs.
  - 6. To confer Confer with and coordinate officials and agencies of other governmental units and congressional committees with regard to Indian needs and goals.
  - 7. To encourage Encourage and propose agreements and accords between federal, state, and local agencies and the several tribal governments, and, pursuant to chapter 54-40.2, to assist in monitoring and negotiating agreements and accords requested when asked by an affected tribe.
