- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-39.2 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a sales and use tax exemption for clothing; and to provide an effective
- 3 date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 57-39.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>Sales tax exemption for clothing.</u> For purposes of this section, "clothing" means all
- 8 <u>human wearing apparel suitable for general use</u>. For purposes of this section:
- 9 <u>1.</u> "Clothing" includes:
- 10 <u>a. Aprons, household and shop;</u>
- b. Athletic supporters;
- 12 c. Baby receiving blankets;
- d. Bathing suits and caps;
- 14 <u>e. Beach capes and coats;</u>
- 15 <u>f.</u> <u>Belts and suspenders;</u>
- 16 <u>g. Boots;</u>
- 17 <u>h. Coats and jackets;</u>
- 18 <u>i.</u> <u>Costumes;</u>
- 19 <u>j. Diapers, children and adult, including disposable diapers;</u>
- 20 k. Ear muffs;
- 21 I. Footlets;
- 22 <u>m. Formal wear;</u>
- 23 <u>n.</u> <u>Garters and garter belts;</u>
- o. Girdles;

"Clothing accessories or equipment" includes: 4 a. Briefcases; 5 Cosmetics; b. 6 C. Hair notions, including barrettes, hair bows, and hair nets; 7 d. Handbags; 8 Handkerchiefs; e. 9 f. Jewelry; 10 Sun glasses, nonprescription; <u>g.</u> 11 Umbrellas; h. 12 <u>i.</u> Wallets; 13 Watches; and į. 14 k. Wigs and hair pieces. 15 4. "Fur clothing" means clothing that is required to be labeled as a fur product under 16 the Federal Fur Products Labeling Act (15 U.S.C. §69), and the value of the fur 17 components in the product is more than three times the value of the next most 18 valuable tangible component. For purposes of this subsection, "fur" means any full 19 or partial animal skin with hair, fleece, or fur fibers attached, either in its raw or 20 processed state, but does not include skins that have been converted into leather 21 or suede or, which in processing, the hair, fleece, or fur fiber has been completely 22 removed. 23 "Protective equipment" means items for human wear and designed as protection of 5. 24 the wearer against injury or disease or as protections against damage or injury of 25 other persons or property but not suitable for general use. "Protective equipment" 26 includes: 27 <u>a.</u> Breathing masks; 28 Clean room apparel and equipment; <u>b.</u> 29 Ear and hearing protectors; C. 30 d. Face shields; 31 Hard hats; e.
