- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-24-04 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the out-of-state public trails and lands access permit.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

7	1.	A re	gistration number must be issued without the payment of a fee for
8		snov	wmobiles owned by the state of North Dakota or any of its political subdivisions
9		upor	n application for the registration.
10	2.	No r	egistration or fees may be required of:
11		a.	Snowmobiles owned and used by the United States or another state or its
12			political subdivisions.
13		b.	Snowmobiles registered in a country other than the United States and
14			temporarily used within this state.
15		с.	Snowmobiles validly licensed in another state and which have not been within
16			this state for more than thirty consecutive days.
17		d.	Snowmobiles operated upon lands owned or leased by the snowmobile
18			owner.
19		e.	Snowmobiles incapable of speeds in excess of ten miles per hour and with an
20			engine displacement of less than one hundred cubic centimeters.
21		f.	Collector snowmobiles. The director may issue a special permit to a person
22			to operate in a parade; organized group outings, including races, rallies, or
23			other promotional events; and for up to ten days each year for personal

1		transportation. The director may impose a reasonable restriction of a
2		permittee and may revoke, amend, suspend, or modify a permit for cause.
3	3.	If a snowmobile is exempt from registration under subdivision b or c of
4		subsection 2, the owner is required to purchase an out-of-state public trails and
5		lands access permit received upon payment of a fifteen dollar per year fee. The
6		permit must be director of the parks and recreation department shall design and
7		provide a permit that consists of a permit form and a single reflective decal. The
8		permit form and the decal must display a corresponding out-of-state public trails
9		and lands access permit number issued by the director of the parks and recreation
10		department. The owner shall display the decal in a visible location on the
11		snowmobile and shall have the permit form in the operator's possession when that
12		individual is operating the snowmobile within the this state. In lieu of the permit
13		form and decal, for online sales the owner shall possess for a period of up to
14		fourteen days from the date of purchase a temporary permit printed at the time of
15		purchase. Dealers or other agents authorized by the director of the parks and
16		recreation department who sell out-of-state public trails and lands access permits
17		may retain one dollar of the fifteen dollar per year fee and the remainder of the fees
18		collected under this subsection must be deposited in the state snowmobile fund.
