- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact five new sections to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code or in the alternative to provide for the certification of gravel pits and forage; and
- 3 to repeal section 63-01.1-12.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to weed-free
- 4 certification of gravel pits, sand pits, and hay land.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. If House Bill No. 1025 does become effective, a new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Certification of gravel pits.

- The commissioner of agriculture shall inspect any gravel pit in this state, when requested to do so by the owner or lessee of the gravel pit. If the commissioner inspects the pit between the twentieth day of June and the tenth day of July, and determines that the noxious weeds in the pit have been controlled, as required by this chapter, the commissioner shall certify that the pit has been inspected and found to be in compliance with the noxious weed laws of this state. A certification issued by the commissioner under this section is valid until April first following the date of the inspection.
- 2. For purposes of this section a "gravel pit" includes any pit or surface area from which sand, gravel, aggregate, scoria, or other road building material is removed.
- **SECTION 2.** If House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, a new section to chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

<u>Certification of forage - Compliance with noxious weed laws.</u> The commissioner of agriculture shall inspect any land from which forage is to be harvested, when requested to do so by the owner or lessee of the land. If the commissioner inspects the land no more than ten days prior to harvesting of the forage and determines that noxious weeds on the land have

1 been controlled, as required by this chapter, and if the commissioner returns upon completion 2 of the forage harvest and verifies that the harvested forage has been stored in an area that is in 3 compliance with the noxious weed laws of this state, the commissioner shall certify that the 4 forage has been harvested from and stored on land that is in compliance with the noxious weed 5 laws of this state. 6 **SECTION 3.** The House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, a new section to 7 chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 8 Certification of forage - Compliance with noxious weed laws. The commissioner of 9 agriculture shall inspect any land from which forage is to be harvested, when requested to do 10 so by the owner or lessee of the land. If the commissioner inspects the land no more than ten 11 days prior to harvesting of the forage and determines that weeds on the land have been 12 controlled, in accordance with standards established by the North American weed management 13 association, and if the commissioner returns upon completion of the forage harvest and verifies 14 that the harvested forage has been stored in an area that is in compliance with the standards 15 established by the North American weed management association, the commissioner shall 16 certify that the forage has been harvested from the stored on land that is in compliance with the 17 standards established by the North American weed management association. 18 **SECTION 4.** If House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, a new section to 19 chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 20 Agents of the commissioner - Designation - Training. The commissioner may 21 designate individuals to serve as agents of the commissioner, for purposes of conducting the 22 inspections permitted by this Act. In order to be designated as an agent, and individual must: 23 1. Be a weed control officer; <u>2.</u> 24 Be determined by the commissioner to have a level of education and experience 25 sufficient to accurately perform the requested certifications; or 26 At least once every thirty-six months, successfully complete a training program <u>3.</u> 27 conducted by the commissioner. 28 **SECTION 5.** If House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, a new section to 29 chapter 63-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 30 **Fees.** The commissioner shall adopt a schedule of fees to be charged for certifications

3	of conducting the inspections permitted by this Act. In order to be designated as an agent, an	
4	individual must:	
5	<u>1.</u>	Be a weed control officer;
6	<u>2.</u>	Be determined by the commissioner to have a level of education and experience
7		sufficient to accurately perform the requested certifications; or
8	<u>3.</u>	At least once every thirty-six months, successfully complete a training program
9		conducted by the commissioner.
10	SECTION 11. REPEAL. If House Bill No. 1025 does not become effective, section	
11	63-01.1-12.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
