- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-10-71 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to fleeing a police officer; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-10-71 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6	39-1	0-71. Fleeing or attempting to elude a peace officer - Penalty.
7	1.	Any A driver of a motor vehicle who willfully fails or refuses to bring the vehicle to a
8		stop , or who otherwise flees or attempts to elude, in any manner, from a pursuing
9		police vehicle or peace officer, when given a visual or audible signal to bring the

- 10 vehicle to a stop, is guilty of a class:
- 11a.Class A misdemeanor for a first offense and a class C felony for a subsequent12offense within three years if after the attempt to stop the vehicle is initiated,
- 13 the driver of the fleeing vehicle does not operate the motor vehicle recklessly
- by disregarding traffic control devices, abruptly changing direction of travel, or
 using speed in a manner to attempt to elude a pursuing vehicle. An
- <u>b.</u> <u>Class C felony if an</u> individual who violates this section while fleeing after or in
 the commission of a felony is guilty of a class C felony.
- 18 2. <u>Class C felony if:</u>
- 19a.After the attempt to stop the vehicle is initiated, the driver of the fleeing vehicle20disregards traffic control devices, abruptly changes direction of travel, or uses21speed in a manner to attempt to elude a pursuing vehicle.
- 22b.Previously convicted under subsection 1 or 2, and engages law enforcement23in another pursuit.
- 24 <u>3.</u> A signal complies with this section if the signal is perceptible to the driver and:

- 1a.If given from a vehicle, the signal is given by hand, voice, emergency light, or2siren, and the stopping vehicle is appropriately marked showing it to be an3official police vehicle; or
- b. If not given from a vehicle, the signal is given by hand, voice, emergency light,
 or siren, and the officer is in uniform and prominently displays the officer's
 badge of office.
