- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-06.2 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to nonresident commercial driver's licenses; and to amend and reenact
- 3 section 39-06.2-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an application for a
- 4 commercial driver's license.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-06.2-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8	39-0	6.2-08. Application for commercial driver's license.
9	1.	The application for a commercial driver's license or commercial driver's instruction
10		permit must include the following:
11		a. The full name and current mailing address of the person applicant;
12		b. A physical description of the person applicant, including sex, height, weight,
13		and eye and hair color;
14		c. Date of birth;
15		d. The applicant's social security number, unless the application is for a
16		nonresident commercial driver's license and the applicant is a resident of a
17		foreign jurisdiction;
18		e. The person's applicant's signature;
19		f. The certifications including those required by 49 CFR part 383.71(a);
20		g. Any other information required by the director; and
21		h. A consent to release driving record information.
22	<u>2.</u>	The application must be accompanied by an application fee of fifteen dollars.

1	<u>3.</u>	If the application is for a nonresident commercial driver's license and the applicant				
2		is a resident of a foreign jurisdiction that does not meet the testing and licensing				
3		standards established by 49 CFR 383, the applicant shall present:				
4		a. A social security card issued to the applicant; and				
5		b. Each of the following:				
6		(1) A passport issued to the applicant by the country of which the applicant				
7		is a resident;				
8		(2) <u>A temporary worker visa; and</u>				
9		(3) <u>A form I-94 arrival/departure record or a successor document.</u>				
10	<del>2.</del> <u>4.</u>	When the holder of a commercial driver's license changes the holder's name or				
11		mailing address, an application for a duplicate license must be made as provided in				
12		section 39-06-18.				
13	<del>3.</del> <u>5.</u>	No person An individual who has been a resident of this state for thirty days may				
14		not drive a commercial motor vehicle under the authority of a commercial driver's				
15		license issued by another jurisdiction.				
16	<del>4.</del> <u>6.</u>	Any person individual who knowingly falsifies information or certifications required				
17		under subsection 1 or 3 is subject to suspension, revocation, or cancellation of the				
18		person's individual's commercial driver's license for a period of at least sixty				
19		consecutive days.				
20	SE	CTION 2. A new section to chapter 39-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
21	21 created and enacted as follows:					
22	No	nresident license.				
23	<u>1.</u>	The department may issue a nonresident commercial driver's license to a resident				
24		of a foreign jurisdiction if the director has determined that the commercial motor				
25		vehicle testing and licensing standards in the foreign jurisdiction do not meet the				
26		testing standards established by 49 CFR 383.				
27	<u>2.</u>	An applicant shall surrender any nonresident commercial driver's license issued by				
28		another state.				
29	<u>3.</u>	Before issuing a nonresident commercial driver's license under this section, the				
30		department shall establish the practical capability of disqualifying the applicant

1		under the conditions applicable to a commercial driver's license issued to a
2		resident of this state.
3	<u>4.</u>	"Nonresident" must appear on the face of a license issued under this section.
4	<u>5.</u>	Except as otherwise provided by this section, a nonresident commercial driver's
5		license other than a temporary nonresident commercial driver's license expires on
6		the earlier of the expiration date of the visa presented under subsection 3 of
7		section 39-06.2-08, or the expiration date of the form I-94 arrival/departure record
8		or a successor document presented under subsection 3 of section 39-06.2-08.
9	<u>6.</u>	The department may issue a temporary nonresident commercial driver's license to
10		an applicant who does not present a social security card as required by section
11		39-06.2-08 but who otherwise meets the requirements for a nonresident
12		commercial driver's license, including the requirement that the commercial motor
13		vehicle testing and licensing standards of the country of which the applicant is a
14		resident not meet the testing and licensing standards established by 49 CFR 383.
15		A license issued under this subsection may not be renewed and expires on the
16		earlier of the sixtieth day after the date the license is issued, the expiration date of
17		a temporary worker visa presented under subsection 3 of section 39-06.2-08, or
18		the expiration date of the form I-94 arrival/departure record or a successor
19		document presented under subsection 3 of section 39-06.2-08.
20	<u>7.</u>	The department may not issue more than one temporary nonresident commercial
21		driver's license per applicant.
22	<u>8.</u>	The fee for a nonresident commercial driver's license is one hundred twenty
23		dollars. The fee for a temporary nonresident commercial driver's license is twenty
24		dollars.
