- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the creation of an early childhood services advisory board.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## **Early childhood services advisory board - Membership - Duties.**

- <u>1.</u> The early childhood services advisory board is composed of seven members appointed by the director of the department. The members of the board must include at least four members who represent for-profit early childhood service providers and not more than three members who represent nonprofit early childhood service providers. The term of office is four years expiring on July thirty-first with no more than two terms expiring in any one year. Of the first members appointed, one member must be appointed for a term of one year, two members must be appointed for terms of two years, two members must be appointed for terms of three years, and two members must be appointed for terms of four years. A vacancy occurring other than by reason of the expiration of a term must be filled in the same manner as the original appointment, except that the appointment may be made for only the remainder of the unexpired term. The members are entitled to be paid for mileage and actual expenses incurred in attending meetings and in performance of their official duties in amounts provided by law for other state officers and employees.
- <u>2.</u> The early childhood services advisory board shall:

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1 Advise the department as the department conducts a review of all early a. 2 childhood services regulations, a review of which the department shall complete before August 1, 2010; 3 4 Upon the completion of the department's review, with the assistance of the <u>b.</u> 5 department, conduct an analysis of and make recommendations regarding the 6 department's review of the early childhood services regulations; and 7 On an ongoing basis, make recommendations to the department regarding <u>C.</u> 8 changes and revisions to the early childhood services regulations. The 9 recommendations, the goal of which is to streamline and improve the quality 10 of early childhood services process, must seek to balance the need for 11 regulations that ensure safe quality child care with the need to revise or 12 eliminate regulations that create unnecessary barriers for early childhood 13 service providers.
