1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 16.1-02 of the North Dakota

- 2 Century Code, relating to voter registration; and to amend and reenact sections 16.1-02-03,
- 3 16.1-02-05, 16.1-02-09, 16.1-02-10, 16.1-02-11, subsection 7 of section 16.1-02-12,
- 4 16.1-02-13, subsections 2 and 3 of section 16.1-05-06, and subsection 4 of section 16.1-05-07
- 5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the registration of voters and the central voter file.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 16.1-02-03. Secretary of state to establish the central voter file with department of
 10 transportation and county auditors.

- Not later than the primary election in 2008, the <u>The</u> secretary of state shall
 establish the central voter file in cooperation with the department of transportation
 and county auditors.
- The secretary of state shall establish the initial central voter file from records
 maintained by the department of transportation. Each county auditor shall
- 16 compare the initial central voter file against all precinct pollbooks used in the
- 17 auditor's county during and created from the general elections in the two previous
- 18 election years and any reasonably reliable updates made by the county auditor
- 19 since the general elections in the two previous election years. Any individual
- 20 contained in the initial central voter file who voted at either of the general elections
- 21 in the two previous election years must be designated as "active" in the initial
- 22 central voter file. Any individual contained in the initial central voter file who did not
- 23 vote at either of the general elections in the two previous election years must be
- 24 designated as "inactive" in the initial central voter file county auditor of each county

1		is responsible for and shall supervise the registration of qualified electors within the
2		county. The county auditor shall maintain within the central voter file a list of each
3		qualified elector who is registered in that county.
4	3.	Each individual contained in the initial central voter file must be assigned a unique
5		identifier. An individual's unique identifier must be created from unique information
6		and data obtained from records maintained by the department of transportation
7		and the pollbooks from the general elections in the two previous election years. If

- 8 it is not possible to assign a unique identifier to an individual contained in the initial
 9 central voter file, a unique identifier must be randomly generated and assigned to
 10 the individual.
- The secretary of state shall adopt rules for generating and assigning a unique
 identifier to each individual contained in the central voter file according to section
 16.1-02-11 and subsection 3 of section 16.1-01-01.
- 5. When establishing the initial central voter file from the records maintained by the
 department of transportation and the pollbooks from the general elections in the
 two previous election years, the secretary of state and county auditors shall
 attempt to correct address errors and misspellings of names.
- 18 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 19 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 20 16.1-02-05. Entry of new voters into the central voter file Registration of electors -
- 21 Query of the central voter file for double voting Verification by mail Challenges -
- 22 **Postelection verification.**
- 23 1. Within sixty days following an election, the county auditor shall enter the name and 24 required information of each individual who voted at the last election who is not 25 already contained in the central voter file and update any required information 26 requested and obtained at the last election for any individual contained in the 27 central voter file. Every qualified elector must be registered in the central voter file 28 of the election precinct in which that elector resides to be entitled to vote at any 29 statewide special, primary, or general election. A qualified elector may register by 30 mail by submitting a completed registration form to the county auditor at any time 31 except during the thirty days before any statewide special, primary, or general

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1		election. Except during the thirty days before a statewide election, a qualified
2		elector may register to vote when applying for or renewing a motor vehicle
3		operator's license, when providing a notice of change of name or address with
4		respect to a motor vehicle operator's license, or when applying for or receiving
5		public assistance. A qualified elector may register at the office of the county
6		auditor by completing a registration form at anytime except during the thirty days
7		before a statewide special, primary, or general election. If a qualified elector
8		applies to the county auditor for an absentee ballot, the elector may request a
9		registration form and may complete and submit the form with the absentee ballot if
10		the registration form is submitted by mail within thirty days of the election. Upon
11		receipt of a registration form, properly completed and signed by the applicant, the
12		county auditor shall register the individual as a qualified elector in the central voter
13		file. Except as otherwise provided under this chapter, the registration of a qualified
14		elector is permanent.
15	2.	The secretary of state, with the assistance of the county auditors, within seventy
16		days following an election, shall query the central voter file to determine if any
17		individual voted more than once during the preceding election. The secretary of
18		state shall immediately notify the county auditor and state's attorney in each
19		affected county for further investigation.
20	3.	The county auditor shall mail to a random sampling of individuals contained in the
21		central voter file a notice stating the individual's name and address as the name
22		and address appear in the central voter file. The random sampling must be
23		determined in the manner established by the secretary of state. The notice must
24		request the individual to notify the county auditor if there is any mistake in the
25		information.
26	4.	Upon return of any nonforwardable mail from an election official, the county auditor
27		shall ascertain the name and address of that individual. If the individual is no
28		longer at the address recorded in the central voter file, the county auditor shall
29		designate the individual as "challenged" in the central voter file. An individual

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Legislative Assembly 1 days after the return of the first nonforwardable mail is also returned by the postal 2 service, the county auditor shall designate the individual as "inactive" in the central 3 voter file. 4 5. Within ninety days after an election, the county auditor shall send the notice 5 provided for under subsection 3 to each individual who was challenged on election 6 day according to section 16.1-05-06. If a notice is returned as not deliverable, the 7 county auditor shall attempt to determine the reason for the return. A county 8 auditor who does not receive or obtain satisfactory proof of an individual's eligibility 9 to vote shall immediately notify the state's attorney to conduct an investigation of 10 the individual's eligibility to vote in that election. 11 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 amended and reenacted as follows: 13 16.1-02-09. Department of transportation to report updates to the secretary of 14 state - Changes to records in the central voter file. 15 1. The department of transportation shall report regularly to the secretary of state any 16 relevant changes and updates to records maintained by the department of 17 transportation which may require changes and updates to be made to records of 18 individuals contained in the central voter file. 19 The county auditor may change the designation of individuals contained in the 2. 20 central voter file whose change of address can be confirmed by the United States 21 postal service. The secretary of state may provide each county auditor with 22 periodic reports on any individual whose change of address can be confirmed by 23 the United States postal service. 24 3. If a qualified elector makes a written request to the county auditor for inclusion in 25 the central voter file, the county auditor shall collect the required information from 26 the individual and add the individual's name to the central voter file with the 27 designation of "inactive". 28 **SECTION 4.** A new section to chapter 16.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

29 created and enacted as follows:

30 Transfer of registration upon request of election. Sixty-first

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1	<u>1.</u>	When an elector changes residence from one precinct to another within a county,		
2		the county auditor, upon application of the elector, shall transfer the elector's		
3		registration record to the proper precinct.		
4	<u>2.</u>	When an elector changes residence from one county to another county, the county		
5		auditor of the county from which the elector moved, upon application of the elector,		
6		shall transfer the elector's registration record to the county auditor of the elector's		
7		county for transfer to the proper precinct.		
8	<u>3.</u>	When a county auditor receives a registration form that indicates that the elector		
9		was previously registered in another county, that county auditor shall notify the		
10		county auditor of the county in which the elector was previously registered so that		
11		the name of the elector may be removed from the central voter file in that county.		
12	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
13	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:		
14	16. 1	I-02-10. Posting voting history - Failure to vote - Individuals designated		
15	inactive . V	Vithin ninety days after each election, each county auditor shall post the voting		
16	history for e	each individual who voted in the election. After the close of the 2010 calendar year,		
17	the secretary of state shall determine if any individual has not voted during the preceding four			
18	years and shall change the status of each such individual to "inactive" in the central voter file.			
19	The secretary of state shall prepare a report to each county auditor which contains the name of			
20	each individ	lual who has been designated as "inactive" in the central voter file. Although not		
21	counted in a	an election, a late absentee ballot from an individual may not be used to designate		
22	an individua	al as "inactive" in the central voter file. A county auditor shall remove the name of an		
23	elector from	n the central voter file upon the written request of the elector.		
24	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
25	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:		
26	16. 1	I-02-11. Secretary of state to adopt rules for the purpose of maintaining the		
27	central vot	er file. The secretary of state shall adopt rules and procedures according to		
28	subsection 3 of section 16.1-01-01 for the purpose of implementing this chapter and for			
29	updating and maintaining the central voter file. The rules must:			
30	1.	Provide for the establishment and maintenance of a central voter file.		

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4	2	Drouide for the registration of electory transfers of registrations, and the removal of
1	2.	Provide for the registration of electors, transfers of registrations, and the removal of
2		registrations from the central voter file consistent with the federal Voter
3		Registration Act [42 U.S.C. 1973gg].
4	<u>3.</u>	Provide for the generation and assignment of a unique identifier to each individual
5		contained in the central voter file.
6	3. <u>4.</u>	Provide procedures for entering data into the central voter file.
7	4. <u>5.</u>	Provide for any additional information to be requested of and obtained from an
8		individual which is to be maintained in the central voter file, not already provided by
9		law, but necessary for the proper administration of the central voter file.
10	5. <u>6.</u>	Provide for the exchange of records maintained by the appropriate state and
11		county agencies and officials for receiving regular reports regarding individuals and
12		records of individuals contained in the central voter file.
13	6. <u>7.</u>	Allow each county auditor and the secretary of state to add, modify, and delete
14		information from in the central voter file to ensure accurate and up-to-date records.
15	7. <u>8.</u>	Allow each county auditor and the secretary of state to have access to the central
16		voter file for review, search, and inquiry capabilities.
17	8. <u>9.</u>	Provide security and protection of all information contained in the central voter file
18		and to ensure that unauthorized access and entry is prohibited.
19	9. <u>10.</u>	Provide a system for each county to identify the precinct to which an individual
20		should be assigned for voting purposes.
21	SEC	CTION 7. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 16.1-02-12 of the North Dakota
22	Century Co	de is amended and reenacted as follows:
23	7.	Beginning in 2008, four Four years of an individual's voting history, if applicable.
24	SEC	CTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
26	16. 1	I-02-13. Information contained in pollbooks generated from the central voter
27	file. The co	ounty auditor shall generate a pollbook for each precinct in the county from the
28	central vote	r file by the day before an election. With the exception of a record designated
29	"secured ac	ctive" and the unique identifier, which are exempt records, the precinct pollbooks are
30	open record	ds under section 44-04-18. Between the fifteenth thirtieth day before the election
31	and the day	\prime of the election, no changes or updates to records of individuals contained in the

1	central voter file or a pollbook generated from the central voter file may be made, other than		
2	changes related to the status of an individual voting early or an individual requesting and		
3	returning ar	absent voter's ballot. The secretary of state shall prescribe procedures for	
4	generating pollbooks and for transporting the pollbooks to the election judges for use on		
5	election day	Pollbooks generated from the central voter file must contain the following	
6	information for each individual contained therein:		
7	1.	The complete legal name of the individual.	
8	2.	The complete residential address of the individual.	
9	3.	The complete mailing address of the individual, if different from the individual's	
10		residential address.	
11	4.	The unique identifier generated and assigned to the individual.	
12	5.	The county, legislative district, city or township, school district, county	
13		commissioner district, if applicable, precinct name, and precinct number in which	
14		the individual resides. A ballot-style code identifying this information may be used	
15		in place of the information required by this subsection.	
16	6.	Any other information requested of and obtained from the individual deemed	
17		necessary by the secretary of state for the proper administration of the pollbook.	
18	SEC	CTION 9. AMENDMENT. Subsections 2 and 3 of section 16.1-05-06 of the North	
19	Dakota Cer	ntury Code are amended and reenacted as follows:	
20	2.	Any member of the election board may challenge the right of an individual to vote if	
21		the election board member has knowledge or has reason to believe the individual	
22		is not a qualified elector. The fact that an individual is included in the central voter	
23		file for a precinct constitutes prima facie evidence of the right of that individual to	
24		vote in that precinct. A poll challenger may request members of the election board	
25		to challenge the right of an individual to vote if the poll challenger has knowledge or	
26		has reason to believe the individual is not a qualified elector of the precinct. A	
27		challenge may be based upon any one of the following:	
28		a. The individual offering to vote does not meet the age or citizenship	
29		requirements.	
30		b. The individual offering to vote has never voted in the precinct before, the	
31		name of the individual offering to vote does not appear in the pollbook	

1			generated from the central voter file, and the individual fails to provide
2			reasonable evidence of residency in the precinct.
3		c.	Except as provided in section 16.1-01-05, the individual offering to vote
4			physically resides outside of the precinct.
5		d.	The individual offering to vote does not meet the residency requirements
6			provided in section 16.1-01-04.
7		e.	The individual offering to vote or if the individual fails or refuses to provide an
8			appropriate form of identification as requested under subsection 3.
9	3.	lf a	fter an election board member has requested that the individual offering to vote
10		pro	vide an appropriate form of identification to address any of the voting eligibility
11		cor	neerns listed in subsection 2 and the identification is not provided or does not
12		ade	equately confirm the eligibility of the challenged individual, the challenged
13		ind	ividual may not vote unless the challenged individual executes an affidavit,
14		ack	nowledged before the election inspector, that the challenged individual is a
15		leg	ally qualified elector of the precinct.
16	SE	стю	N 10. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 16.1-05-07 of the North Dakota
17	Century Co	ode is	amended and reenacted as follows:
18	4.	a.	When verifying an individual's eligibility or when entering the name of an
19			individual into the pollbook, poll clerks shall request, correct, and update any
20			incorrect or incomplete information about an individual required to be included
21			in the pollbook generated from the central voter file.
22		b.	If the individual's name is contained in the pollbook generated from the central
23			voter file, the poll clerks shall verify the individual's residential address and
24			mailing address, if different from the individual's residential address.
25		c.	If the individual's name is not contained in the pollbook generated from the
26			central voter file but the individual is determined eligible to vote, the poll clerks
27			shall record the individual's name in the pollbook. The poll clerks shall
28			request and obtain any additional information for the individual required to be
29			included in the pollbook.
