- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 4-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the promotion of sustainably grown agricultural commodities; to
- 3 provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 4-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 6 created and enacted as follows:

7 Sustainably grown in North Dakota - Application - Logo - Promotion of

8 commodities.

9	<u>1.</u>	The agriculture commissioner shall implement a program to promote agricultural
10		commodities that are sustainably grown in North Dakota.
11	<u>2.</u>	A producer may apply to the commissioner and upon demonstrating that the
12		producer's growing practices with respect to a particular commodity meet the
13		commissioner's established criteria for sustainability, the commissioner shall
14		authorize the producer to label and market the commodity as being sustainably
15		grown in North Dakota.
16	<u>3.</u>	The commissioner shall develop and make available for the use of authorized
17		producers a logo indicating that the commodity is sustainably grown in North
18		Dakota. The commissioner shall actively support and promote the sale and use of
19		products identified as sustainably grown in North Dakota.
20	<u>4.</u>	The commissioner may establish and charge producers a fee for participating in
21		the program. The commissioner shall forward all fees collected under this section
22		to the state treasurer for deposit in the general fund.
23	<u>5.</u>	For purposes of this section, "sustainably grown" means that a crop is grown using
24		research-based practices that result in:

6				use, improve human health through access to safe and nutritious food, and			
7				enhance economic opportunities for individual producers;			
8			<u>d.</u>	Explore metric evaluations to measure the attainment, maintenance, and			
9				certification of sustainability; and			
10			<u>e.</u>	Advise the commissioner regarding the development of a sustainability			
11				certification program and the marketing and packaging of products containing			
12				the certification.			
13	2	<u>3.</u>	The	committee may accept gifts, grants, and donations of money, property, and			
14			<u>serv</u>	vices. All moneys received as gifts, grants, or donations are appropriated on a			
15			con	tinuing basis to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of carrying out

17	-	<u>4.</u>	Eac	h legislative member of the committee is entitled to receive per diem			
18			<u>com</u>	pensation in the amount established by subsection 1 of section 54-03-20 plus			
19			reim	bursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers if the member is			
20			<u>atte</u>	nding meetings or performing duties directed by the committee.
