SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.

1	A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the use of passenger rail
2	transportation within this state.
3	WHEREAS, the cost of transportation by automobile has greatly increased due to the
4	increase in the price of petroleum products; and
5	WHEREAS, railroad tracks unite many of the small towns in this state with cities that
6	contain shopping and medical facilities; and
7	WHEREAS, some of these cities connect to the Empire Builder Amtrak service
8	providing access to major cities in the northern part of the United States; and
9	WHEREAS, passenger rail provides a more fuel-efficient and cleaner transportation
10	system, helping to reduce America's dependence on foreign oil; and
11	WHEREAS, shifting transportation to rail service will lessen the burden of transportation
12	on the overstressed highway systems in this state; and
13	WHEREAS, this state is a member of the Midwest interstate passenger rail compact,
14	the purpose of which is to promote passenger rail service in the Midwest and a combined
15	seamless local rail transit system would provide an energy efficient and cost-effective means of
16	travel throughout the region, and combined with the Amtrak system, would provide the same
17	travel throughout the nation;
18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE
19	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
20	That the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly directs the Legislative Council to study the use
21	of passenger rail transportation within this state; and
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and
23	recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
24	the Sixty-second Legislative Assembly.
