1	A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the grading of oilseeds in this
2	state.
3	WHEREAS, the Grain Inspection, Packers and Stockyards Administration maintains the
4	official United States standards for grains, oilseeds, and related commodities; and
5	WHEREAS, official inspections of grains, oilseeds, and other related commodities are
6	based on the established standards and require the use of sound, proven, and standardized
7	procedures, techniques, and equipment; and
8	WHEREAS, all of the federal, state, and private partners that comprise the official
9	system are strictly guided by the United States Grain Standards Act and the Agricultural
10	Marketing Act of 1946; and
11	WHEREAS, the standards are used each day by domestic and international sellers and
12	buyers as a common commercial language to quickly and effectively communicate the type and
13	quality of product being bought and sold; and
14	WHEREAS, grading agricultural commodities helps to ensure that producers are paid
15	the maximum value for their product based on its quality; and
16	WHEREAS, questions and concerns always exist in the minds of producers about the
17	accuracy of the testing equipment, the qualifications of test personnel, and the consistency of
18	the results;
19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
20	OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
21	That the Legislative Council study the grading of oilseeds in this state; and
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and
23	recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
24	the Sixty-second Legislative Assembly.
