1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress to enact meaningful payment limit reform that sets a

2 hard cap on farm program payments to any one individual at \$250,000 and requires that all

3 payment recipients be actively engaged in farming.

WHEREAS, the system of farm program payments administered by the Farm Service
Agency of the United States Department of Agriculture constitutes a necessary safety net for
family farmers and ranchers; and

WHEREAS, this farm program payment system makes annual payments to individuals
who are not actively engaged in farming, as well as corporate mega-farms beyond what is a
reasonable level of federal support; and

WHEREAS, this practice of improper and excessive payments undermines the very
existence of the farm safety net and erodes support for those family farmers who depend on the
farm program;

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

14 OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to enact meaningful payment limit reform that sets a hard cap on farm program payments to any one individual at \$250,000 and requires that all payment recipients be actively engaged in farming; and
