## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.

- 1 A concurrent resolution to create and enact a new section to article X of the Constitution of
- 2 North Dakota, relating to the creation of a public health investment trust fund.

## 3 STATEMENT OF INTENT

- 4 This measure provides for the creation of a public health investment trust fund that is to be used
- 5 for the funding of tobacco prevention and cessation efforts and other public health programs.

## 6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF

## REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

- 8 That the following proposed new section to article X of the Constitution of North Dakota
- 9 is agreed to and must be submitted to the qualified electors of North Dakota at the next
- 10 statewide election, in accordance with section 16 of article IV of the Constitution of North
- 11 Dakota.

- 12 **SECTION 1.** A new section to article X of the Constitution of North Dakota is created
- 13 and enacted as follows:
- 14 The public health investment trust fund is created in the state treasury. The fund
- 15 consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained by the state under section IX(c)(2) of the
- 16 agreement adopted by the east central judicial district court in its judgment entered
- 17 December 28, 1998 [Civil No. 98-3778]. Earnings on the fund must be credited to the fund and
- 18 <u>deposited in the fund</u>. The legislative assembly shall appropriate the earnings on the fund to
- 19 the state department of health for distribution to public health units for the purpose of providing
- 20 funds for tobacco prevention and cessation efforts and other public health programs. The
- 21 principal of the public health investment trust fund may not be expended before January 1,
- 22 2021, and then only for public health programs and only upon a two-thirds vote of the members
- 23 elected to each house of the legislative assembly.
