## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3067

1 A concurrent resolution urging the restoration, through legal or political means, of the  
2 Environmental Protection Agency's final rule exempting pesticides from the Clean Water Act's  
3 permitting requirements.

4 **WHEREAS**, on November 27, 2007, the Environmental Protection Agency issued a final  
5 rule providing that pesticides applied in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and  
6 Rodenticide Act are exempt from the Clean Water Act's permitting requirements; and

7 **WHEREAS**, in National Cotton Council of America v. United States Environmental  
8 Protection Agency, the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit vacated the  
9 agency's rule on the basis that pesticide residues and biological pesticides constitute pollutants  
10 under federal law and must be regulated under the Clean Water Act in order to minimize the  
11 impact to human health and the environment; and

12 **WHEREAS**, with this decision, farmers, ranchers, utility owners, golf course owners,  
13 and state, local, and federal public entities, among others, will be required to obtain national  
14 pollutant discharge elimination system permits; and

15 **WHEREAS**, this decision inevitably will result in complications and delays that will  
16 seriously impact the effective and time-sensitive use of pesticides to combat disease and  
17 crop-destroying insects, and seriously impact the ability of farmers and ranchers to engage in  
18 food production;

19 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES**  
20 **OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:**

21 That the Sixty-first Legislative Assembly supports the restoration, through legal or  
22 political means, of the Environmental Protection Agency's final rule exempting pesticides from  
23 the Clean Water Act's permitting requirements, provided that the pesticides are applied in  
24 accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act; and

- 1           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
- 2 resolution to the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture, the Secretary of the
- 3 Environmental Protection Agency, and to each member of the North Dakota Congressional
- 4 Delegation.
