- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 human services; to amend and reenact sections 50-06-29, 50-24.1-02.3, and 50-29-04 of the
- 3 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the establishment of an aging and disability resource
- 4 center, the exempt amount of designated pre-need funeral service contracts in considering
- 5 eligibility for medical assistance, and eligibility under the state children's health insurance
- 6 program.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of human services for the purpose of defraying the expenses of its various divisions for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011.

SECTION 3. FUNDING TRANSFERS - EXCEPTION - AUTHORIZATION.

Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the department of human services may transfer appropriation authority between line items within each subdivision of section 1 of this Act and between subdivisions within section 1 of this Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. The department shall notify the office of management and budget of any transfer made pursuant to this section. The department shall report to the budget section after June 30, 2010, any transfers made in excess of \$50,000 and to the appropriations committees of the sixty-second legislative assembly regarding any transfers made pursuant to this section.

SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - LIMIT - HEALTH CARE TRUST FUND. The estimated income line item in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$3,000,000 from the

- 1 health care trust fund for nursing facilities. The department of human services expenditures
- 2 from this fund may not exceed this amount for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending
- 3 June 30, 2011.

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SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

50-06-29. Application for aging Aging and disability resource center funding. No later than December 31, 2007, the The department of human services shall seek federal funds for the planning plan and implementation implement of an aging and disability resource center for the state. The resource center will be a single point of information program at the community level which will help people make informed decisions about the full range of long-term care service and support options, including both institutional and home and community-based care, and which will provide unbiased information and assistance to individuals needing either public or private resources, to professionals seeking assistance on behalf of their clients, and to individuals planning for their future long-term care needs. Upon receipt of federal funds, the The department of human services may establish the aging and disability resource center or it may request bids and award a contract for the provision of this service. The duties of the aging and disability resource center must include all duties required to receive federal funds, including by the 2006 amendments to the Older Americans Act [Pub. L. 109-365; 120 Stat. 2522; 42 U.S.C. 3001 et seq.], providing information about the full range of long-term care service and support options available in the state to assure that consumers may make informed decisions about their care. The resource center must be free from a conflict of interest which would inappropriately influence or bias the actions of a contractor, staff member, board member, or volunteer of the resource center to limit the information given to a consumer to steer the consumer to services that may also be provided by the resource center.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.1-02.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

50-24.1-02.3. When designated pre-need funeral service contracts, prepayments, or deposits not to be considered in eligibility determination. In determining eligibility for medical assistance, the department of human services may not consider as an available resource any pre-need funeral service contracts, prepayments, or deposits to a fund which total five seven thousand dollars or less designated by the applicant or recipient as set-aside to pay

1 for the applicant's or recipient's funeral. An applicant or recipient designates a prepayment or 2 deposit for that applicant's or recipient's burial by providing funds that are to be used for the 3 funeral or burial expenses of the applicant or recipient. In addition, the applicant or recipient 4 may designate all or a portion of the three thousand dollar asset limitation for funeral pre-need 5 contracts, prepayments, or deposits. Interest or earnings retained in a funeral fund also may 6 not be considered as an available resource. A pre-need funeral service contract, prepayment, 7 or deposit designated under this section is not a multiple-party account for purposes of chapter 8 30.1-31. No claim for payment of funeral expenses may be made against the estate of a 9 deceased medical assistance recipient except to the extent that funds maintained in 10 accordance with this section total less than five seven thousand dollars. 11 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 50-29-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 amended and reenacted as follows: 13 **50-29-04. Plan requirements.** The plan: 14 1. Must be provided through private contracts with insurance carriers; 2. 15 Must allow conversion to another health insurance policy; 3. 16 Must be based on an actuarial equivalent of a benchmark plan; 17 4. Must incorporate every state-required waiver approved by the federal government; 18 5. Must include community-based eligibility outreach services; and 19 6. Must provide: 20 A net income eligibility limit of one two hundred fifty percent of the poverty 21 line: 22 b. A copayment requirement for each pharmaceutical prescription and for each 23 emergency room visit; 24 C. A deductible for each inpatient hospital visit: 25 d. Coverage for: 26 (1) Inpatient hospital, medical, and surgical services; 27 (2) Outpatient hospital and medical services; Psychiatric and substance abuse services; 28 (3)29 (4) Prescription medications; 30 (5) Preventive screening services; 31 (6)Preventive dental and vision services; and

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- 1 (7) Prenatal services; and
- e. A coverage effective date that is the first day of the month, following the date of application and determination of eligibility.
