1 A BILL for an Act to establish a P-20 education council.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

3	SEC	TION 1. P-20 education council established - members and terms.: <u>A P-20</u>
4	education c	ouncil is established consisting of the following members:
5	<u>1.</u>	The governor or governor's designee, who is the chairman;
6	<u>2.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction;
7	<u>3.</u>	The commissioner of higher education;
8	<u>4.</u>	The director of the North Dakota department of career and technical education;
9	<u>5.</u>	Two members of the state board of higher education selected by that board to
10		serve a term of at least one year but not longer than their term of office on the
11		board;
12	<u>6.</u>	Two members of the state board of public school education selected by that board
13		to serve a term of at least one year but not longer than their term of office on the
14		board;
15	<u>7.</u>	Two members of the education standards and practices board selected by that
16		board to serve a term of at least one year but not longer than their term of office on
17		the board;
18	<u>8.</u>	Two members of the state board for career and technical education selected by
19		that board to serve a term of at least one year but not longer than their term of
20		office on the board;
21	<u>9.</u>	Two members of the senate, including one member from each party selected by
22		the chairman of the legislative council, one of whom shall serve an initial two-year
23		term following which the term shall be four years and one of whom shall be
24		appointed to a four-year term:

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1	<u>10.</u>	Two members of the house of representatives, including one member from each
2		party selected by the chairman of the legislative council, one of whom shall serve
3		an initial two-year term following which the term shall be four years and one of
4		whom shall be appointed to a four-year term;
5	<u>11.</u>	The executive director of the North Dakota school boards association;
6	<u>12.</u>	The executive director of the North Dakota council of educational leaders;
7	<u>13.</u>	The president of the North Dakota education association;
8	<u>14.</u>	The president of the North Dakota university system council of college faculties;
9	<u>15.</u>	The president and vice president of the North Dakota student association;
10	<u>16.</u>	Three members appointed by the governor who are elementary or secondary
11		school teachers or administrators, one of whom shall serve an initial two-year term
12		following which the term shall be four years and two of whom shall be appointed to
13		four-year terms;
14	<u>17.</u>	One member appointed by the governor who has special knowledge and expertise
15		relating to special education, who shall serve a four-year term;
16	<u>18.</u>	One member appointed by the governor who has special knowledge and expertise
17		in preschool or early childhood education, who shall serve an initial two-year term
18		following which the term shall be four years;
19	<u>19.</u>	Two members appointed by the commissioner of higher education who are higher
20		education institution faculty members, one of whom shall serve an initial two-year
21		term following which the term shall be four years and one of whom shall be
22		appointed to a four-year term;
23	<u>20.</u>	Three members appointed by the commissioner of higher education who are
24		higher education institution administrators, two of whom shall serve initial two-year
25		terms following which the terms shall be four years and one of whom shall be
26		appointed to a four-year term;
27	<u>21.</u>	Two members appointed by the governor representing parents who must at the
28		time of appointment have a child attending a school or higher education institution
29		in the state, one of whom shall serve an initial two-year term following which the
30		term shall be four years and one of whom shall be appointed to a four-year term;

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1 22. Two members appointed by the governor representing state tribal schools or with 2 special knowledge and expertise regarding Indian education issues, one of whom 3 shall serve an initial two-year term following which the term shall be four years and 4 one of whom shall be appointed to a four-year term; and 5 23. Eight members appointed by the governor representing business and community 6 leaders, for of whom shall serve initial two-year terms following which the term 7 shall be four years and four of whom shall be appointed to four-year terms. 8 The governor or governor's designee may appoint a member as a cochairman to serve 9 as chairman if the governor or governor's designee is absent or unable to preside at a meeting 10 or perform other functions. 11 Members who are officers or employees of the state or members of a state board are 12 entitled to reimbursement of expenses by their respective state agencies or institutions or 13 boards for attending meetings and performing other functions of office. Legislators are entitled 14 to reimbursement of expenses in the same manner and amounts as provided for legislative 15 council committee meetings. Other members are entitled to reimbursement of expenses in the 16 same manner and amounts as state officials for attending meetings and performing other 17 functions of office. Members shall not be entitled to additional compensation, although 18 members who are officers or employees of the state or a political subdivision must be released 19 from their regular duties for time required to attend council meetings and perform other 20 functions of office without loss of pay and benefits. 21 SECTION 2. P-20 education council - meetings - Staff - Funding. The P-20 22 education council shall meet at least twice annually and at times and locations designated by 23 the chairman. The legislative council shall provide necessary staff support and reimbursement 24 of expenses and other necessary funds to support the council. 25 SECTION 3. P-20 education council - Duties. The P-20 education council shall: 26 Not later than September 30, 2010, submit to the governor and legislative council a 1. 27 report that includes steps designed to make the North Dakota education system, 28 from preschool through graduate and postgraduate education, a national leader 29 with standards and expectations equivalent to the best-performing countries in the 30 world. Among other items, the report must address and make recommendations 31 regarding:

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1		<u>a.</u>	Common performance standards and assessments for high school	
2			graduation, preparation for work and college;	
3		<u>b.</u>	Alignment of P-12 standards and postsecondary curriculum;	
4		<u>C.</u>	More rigorous curriculum and increased expectations;	
5		<u>d.</u>	Career planning; and	
6		<u>e.</u>	Use of a state longitudinal data system for education improvement.	
7	<u>2.</u>	Beginning in 2012 and not later than September thirtieth of each even-numbered		
8		year, submit to the governor and legislative council a report that includes an		
9		<u>eva</u>	luation of the state's education system, progress in implementing prior	
10		reco	ommendations and revised or additional recommendations designed to make	
11		<u>the</u>	North Dakota education system a national leader with standards and	
12		<u>exp</u>	ectations equivalent to the best-performing countries in the world or, once that	
13		<u>stat</u>	us is attained, to retain that status.
