- 3 Code, relating to licensing of dental assistants and hygienists and dentists; to amend and
- 4 reenact sections 43-20-03, 43-20-05, 43-20-06, 43-20-08, 43-20-09, 43-20-10, 43-20-12.2,
- 5 43-20-13.1, and 43-28-01, subsection 2 of section 43-28-06, sections 43-28-08, 43-28-10,
- 6 43-28-11, 43-28-13, and 43-28-15, 43-28-16, 43-28-17, and 43-28-18, subsection 1 of section
- 7 43-28-18.1, and sections 43-28-24 and 43-28-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 8 the practice and licensing of dental assistants and hygienists and dentist; to repeal sections
- 9 43-20-01, 43-20-02, 43-20-07, 43-20-12.1, 43-28-12, 43-28-12.1, 43-28-12.2, 43-28-14,
- 10 43-28-19, 43-28-20, 43-28-21, and 43-28-22 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 11 practice and licensing dental hygienists and dentist; and to provide an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is
created and enacted as follows:

15 Definitions. As used in this chapter and chapter 43-28, unless the context otherwise
16 requires:

- <u>"Dental assistant" means an individual who provides dental assistance under the</u>
 <u>supervision of a dentist and within the scope of practice established by rule and</u>
 <u>section 43-20-13.</u>
- 20 <u>2.</u> <u>"Dental hygienist" means an individual licensed to practice dental hygiene.</u>
- <u>3.</u> "Registered dental assistant" means an individual registered as a registered dental
 <u>assistant to provide dental assistance as set forth by rule.</u>
- 234."Qualified dental assistant" means an individual registered as a qualified dental24assistant to provide dental assistance as set for by rule.

1	SEC	CTION 2. A new section to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
2	created and	d enacted as follows:	
3	Dental hygienist licensing. An individual seeking to practice dental hygiene in this		
4	state shall apply to the executive director of the board on forms prescribed by the board. The		
5	application	must be verified under oath to the effect that all of the statements contained in the	
6	application	are true of the applicant's own knowledge, and must be received by the executive	
7	director of t	he board at least thirty days before the board meeting at which it is considered. The	
8	applicant sl	nall enclose with the application a recent autographed picture of the applicant and an	
9	application	fee as determined by the board by rule. The board may grant a license to practice	
10	dental hygie	ene to an applicant who has met all of the following requirements:	
11	<u>1.</u>	The applicant is a graduate of a dental hygiene school accredited by the American	
12		dental association's commission on dental accreditation.	
13	<u>2.</u>	The applicant passed an examination administered by the joint commission on	
14		national dental examinations.	
15	<u>3.</u>	The applicant passed on clinical competency examination administered by a	
16		regional dental testing service or a licensing jurisdiction approved by the board by	
17		<u>rule.</u>	
18	<u>4.</u>	The applicant passed, within on year of making application, a written examination	
19		on the laws and rules governing the practice of dentistry in this state.	
20	<u>5.</u>	Grounds for denial of the application under section 43-20-05 do not exist.	
21	<u>6.</u>	The applicant met any requirements for licensure established by the board by rule.	
22	SEC	CTION 3. A new section to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is

24	Lice	ensure by credential review. Applications for licensure to practice dental hygiene	
25	by credentia	al review shall be made on forms provided by the board, and submitted thirty days	
26	prior to the examination administered by the board. The board may issue a license and		
27	certificate o	f registration to practice dental hygiene to an applicant who meets all the following	
28	<u>requiremen</u>	<u>ts.</u>	
29	<u>2.</u>	The applicant, for at least three years immediately preceding application, has been	
30		licensed in good standing and has been actively practicing dental hygiene in	

1 another jurisdiction where the requirements are at least substantially equivalent to 2 those of this state. 3 3. The applicant pays to the board the fee determined by the board of rule. 4 4. The applicant delivers to the board a certificate from the examining or licensing 5 board of every jurisdiction in which the individual is licensed to practice, certifying 6 that the individual is a licensed and registered dental hygienist in good standing in 7 that jurisdiction. 8 The applicant passes a written examination on the laws and rules governing the 5. 9 practice of dentistry in this state administered by the board at a meeting. 10 The applicant meets any requirement for licensure established by the board by 6. 11 rule. 12 **SECTION 4.** A new section to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 created and enacted as follows: 14 License renewal - audit. 15 1. All licenses of dental hygienists expire after December thirty-first of every 16 odd-numbered year. 17 Licenses may be renewed by December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year by 2. 18 submitting a renewal application, an renewal fee established by the board by rule, 19 and proof of completion of the continuing education requirements established by 20 the board by rule, provided the dental hygienist's license is not revoked or grounds 21 for denial under section 43-20-05 do not exist. 22 If the renewal application, renewal fee, and proof of completion of continuing 3. 23 education are not received by December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year, the 24 license expires and the dental hygienist may not practice dental hygiene. 25 For sixty days after December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year, an expired 4. 26 license may be renewed by submitting the renewal application, renewal fee, proof 27 of completion of continuing education, and a late fee established by the board by 28 rule. 29 If the renewal application, renewal fee, proof of completion of continuing education, 5. 30 and late fee are not received within sixty days after December thirty-first of the

1 odd-numbred year, the license may not be renewed, and the dental hygienist must 2 apply for and meet the requirements for licensure to be granted a license. 3 The board may extend the renewal deadlines for a dental hygienist providing proof 6. 4 of medial or other hardship rendering the dental hygienist unable to meet the 5 deadline. 6 7. The board may select a random sample of the license renewal applications for 7 audit of continuing education credits. Each licensee shall maintain certificates or 8 records of continuing education activities. Upon receiving notice of an audit from 9 the board, a licensee shall provide satisfactory documentation of attendance at, or 10 participation in, the continuing education activities listed on the licensee's 11 continuing education form. The failure to comply with the audit is grounds for 12 nonrenewal of or disciplinary action against the license. 13 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-20-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 14 amended and reenacted as follows: 15 43-20-03. Dental hygienists - Practice by. As used in this chapter, "dental hygiene" 16 and the practice thereof means the removal of accumulated matter from the natural and 17 restored surfaces of teeth and from restorations in the human mouth, the polishing of such 18 surfaces, and the topical application of drugs to the surface tissues of the mouth and to the 19 surface of teeth if such acts are performed under the direct, modified general, or general 20 supervision of a licensed dentist. General supervision may be utilized only used if the following 21 conditions are met: 22 The patient is a patient of record who has been examined by the dentist within the 1. 23 past twelve months: 24 2. The patient is being treated at the primary or satellite practice location of the 25 supervising dentist, a public health setting, a hospital, a long-term care facility, or in 26 an institutional type setting; 27 3. A current treatment plan is in place; and 28 4. Any delegated procedure is preauthorized by the supervising dentist. 29 Only a person licensed as a dental hygienist may be referred to as a dental hygienist. 30 Additional tasks permitted to be performed by licensed dental hygienists may be outlined by the 31 board of dental examiners by appropriate rules.

13		chapter.
14	4.	Gross inefficiency in the practice of dental hygiene. The board may suspend or
15		revoke, with power to reinstate, the license of any licensed dentist who permits any
16		dental hygienist, operating under the dentist's supervision, to perform any
17		operation other than that permitted under this chapter, or who knowingly permits
18		any person who is not a licensed dental hygienist to perform any operations or
19		services as such under that dentist's supervision.

21		individual's ability to service the public as a dental hygienist or a registered or
22		qualified dental assistant, or the board determines, following conviction for any
23		offense, that the individual is not sufficiently rehabilitated under section

25	<u>6.</u>	Been adjudged mentally ill and not judicially restored by the regularly constituted
26		authorities.
27	<u>7.</u>	Abused, is dependent on, or addicted to the use of alcohol of drugs.
28	<u>8.</u>	Engaged in fraud or deceit in obtaining a dental hygiene license or dental assisting
29		registration.
30	<u>9.</u>	Disclosed confidential information.

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1	<u>10.R</u>	eceived a fee from a dentist or anyone for the referral of patients to a dentist or	
2		dental hygienist.	
3	<u>11.</u>	Used improper, unfair or unethical measures to draw dental patronage from the	
4		practice of another licensee.	
5	<u>12.</u>	Fraudulently prescribed or dispensed drugs or medications.	
6	<u>13.</u>	Knowingly submitting any misleading, deceptive, untrue, or fraudulent information	
7		on a claim for, bill, or statement to a third party.	
8	<u>14.</u>	Advised or directed patients to dental laboratories or dental laboratory technicians	
9		for any dental service or advised or directed patients to deal directly with

22	SEC	CTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
23	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
24	43-2	20-06. License - Cancellation - Inactive status. At least thirty days before	
25	January fire	t of each even-numbered year, the board of dental examiners shall send a renewal	
26	notice that	includes a form for continuing education reporting and an application for license	
27	renewal to	each licensee at the licensee's last place of residence as noted in the records of the	
28	board. If a	licensee fails to pay the biennial fee for the renewal of the certificate of registration	
29	on or before the due date of the payment, after thirty days' written notice of the default, the		
30	board may	cancel the license without a hearing. The board shall record the cancellation and	
31	notify the d	ental hygienist of the cancellation. The payment of the biennial fee within that	

1 thirty day period, with an additional sum determined by the board, excuses the default. Upon 2 payment of a fee determined by the board, a licensee dental hygienist may request to have the 3 licensee's dental hygienist's license placed on inactive status upon expiration of the license. 4 While on inactive status, the individual dental hygienist may not engage in the practice of dental 5 hygiene in the state until the individual submits a renewal application, pays the renewal fee, and 6 meets any additional requirements established by rule of the board. 7 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-20-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 43-20-08. Unlawful to employ unlicensed hygienist – Unlawful to practice without 10 license or registration. No person may practice dental hygiene or practice as a registered or 11 gualified dental assistant in the state of North Dakota, without first obtaining from the North 12 Dakota state board of dental examiners a license authorizing such person to practice dental 13 hygiene in this state, and it is unlawful for any person to employ an unlicensed dental hygienist 14 for the performance of any operations or services as such, or permit such unlicensed person to 15 perform any operations or services as such, under that person's supervision or registration. No 16 person may practice as a dental assistant outside the scope of practice established by by the 17 board by rule and section 43-20-13. 18 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is 19 amended and reenacted as follows: 20 43-20-09. Violation of chapter a misdemeanor. Any person violating any provision of 21 this chapter section 43-20-10 is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. 22 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 amended and reenacted as follows: 24 43-20-10. State board of dental examiners - Authority - Duty. The North Dakota 25 state board of dental examiners has the power and it is its duty to enforce the provisions of this 26 chapter. The board has the power to make such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with 27 this chapter, as may, in its judgment, be necessary for the proper enforcement of this chapter, 28 and the examination of dental hygienists and registered and qualified dental assistants for their 29 conduct and practice. For the purposes of this chapter, the board has the powers set forth in 30 43-28-06.

1	SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-12.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	43-20-12.2. Notice to board of change of address. A licensed dental hygienist shall
4	notify the executive director of the board of dental examiners of any new address within thirty
5	days of the address change. The notice required under this section must be given by certified
6	mail, return receipt requested. A licensed dental hygienist may not practice in this state for
7	more than thirty days after the change of address without complying with this section.
8	SECTION 12. A new section to chapter 43-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	created and enacted as follows:
10	Registered and qualified dental assistant registration. To be registered as a
11	registered or qualified dental assistant, an individual shall apply and meet the requirements
12	established by the board by rule.
13	SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-13.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14	amended and reenacted as follows:
15	43-20-13.1. Continuing education requirement for registered dental assistants
16	Registration renewal.
17	1. At least thirty days before January first of each year the board of dental examiners
18	shall send a renewal notice that includes an affidavit for continuing education
19	reporting and an application for registration renewal to each registrant at the
20	registrant's last place of residence as noted in the records of the board. If a
21	registrant fails to pay the fee for the renewal of the certificate of registration on or
22	before the due date of the payment, after thirty days' written notice of the default,
23	the board may cancel the registration without a hearing. The board shall record
24	the cancellation and notify the dental assistant of the cancellation. Each individual
25	registered as a dental assistant shall provide the board evidence satisfactory to the
26	board that the individual has attended or participated in the amount of continuing
27	education as is required by the board. The board may establish a minimum
28	continuing education requirement which may not be less than eight hours during a
29	twelve-month registration. The board may accept for compliance with the
30	continuing education requirement any of the following activities which may
31	contribute directly to the dental education of the registrant:

1		a. Proof of attendance at a lecture, study club, college postgraduate course, or
2		scientific session of a convention.
3		b. Proof of research, graduate study, teaching, or service as a clinician.
4		c. Proof of any other continuing education approved by the board.
5	2.	The board may select a random sample of the registrants for audit of continuing
6		education credits. Each registrant shall maintain certificates or records of
7		continuing education credit. The board shall notify a registered dental assistant
8		selected for a continuing education audit. If a registered dental assistant is
9		selected for a continuing education audit, the dental assistant shall provide
10		satisfactory documentation of attendance at or participation in the continuing
11		education activitics included on the registrant's sworn affidavit. The failure to
12		comply with an audit may be grounds for nonrenewal of the registration. A dental
13		assistant who fails to comply with the continuing education requirements may be
14		reexamined by the board to determine the individual's competency to continue
15		engaging in dental assisting activities. If the board determines that the dental
16		assistant is not qualified, the board shall suspend the registration until the
17		individual provides acceptable evidence to the board of the individual's
18		competency to practice as a dental assistant All registrations of registered and
19		qualified dental assistants expire after December thirty-first of every
20		even-numbered year.
21	<u>2.</u>	A registration may be renewed by submitting a renewal application, renewal fee
22		established by the board by rule, and proof of completion of the continuing
23		education requirements established by the board by rule, provided the registration
24		is not revoked or grounds for denial under section 43-20-05 doe not exist.
25	<u>3.</u>	If the renewal application, renewal fee, and proof of completion of continuing
26		education are not received by December thirty-first of the even-numbered year, the
27		registration expires and the registered or qualified dental assistant may not practice
28		as a registered or qualified dental assistant.
29	<u>4.</u>	For sixty days after December thirty-first of the even-numbered year, an expired
30		registration may be renewed by submitting the renewal application, renewal fee,

1 proof of completion of continuing education, and a late fee established by the 2 board by rule. 3 If the renewal application, renewal fee, proof of completion of continuing education, 5. 4 and late fee are not received within sixty days after December thirty-first of the 5 even-numbered year, the registration may not be renewed, and the registered or 6 qualified dental assistant must apply for and meet the requirements for registration 7 to be granted registration. 8 The board maya extend the renewal deadline for a registered or gualified dental 6. 9 assistant providing proof of medical or other hardship rendering the registered or 10 gualified dental assistant unable to meet the deadline. 11 SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 amended and reenacted as follows: 13 **43-28-01.** Definitions. As used in this chapter and chapter 43-20, unless the context 14 otherwise requires: 15 1. "Accredited dental school" means a dental school, college, or university accredited 16 by the commission on dental accreditation of the American dental association or its 17 successor. 18 <u>2.</u> "Advertising" means to invite the attention of or give notice to the public, by any 19 means, medium, or manner whatsoever of any fact, information, or data pertaining 20 to or being conducive of the practice of dentistry in this state. 21 2. 3. "Board" means the state board of dental examiners. 22 3. <u>4.</u> "Certificate of registration" means a written statement of the board declaring that a 23 licensed dentist has paid the biennial registration fee required by this chapter. 24 4. 5Dentist" means an individual who has a license to practice in this state and who 25 holds a valid biennial certificate of registration. 26 License" means the right, authority, or permission granted by the board to practice 5. 27 dentistry in this state. 28 For the purposes of this chapter, the term "practice Practice of dentistry" includes 6. <u>7.</u> 29 means examination, diagnosis, treatment, repair, administration of local or general 30 anesthetics, prescriptions, or surgery of or for any disease, disorder, deficiency, 31 deformity, discoloration, condition, lesion, injury, or pain of the human oral cavity,

- teeth, gingivae, and soft tissues, and the diagnosis, surgical, and adjunctive
 treatment of the diseases, injuries, and defects of the upper and lower human jaw
 and associated structures.
- SECTION 15. A new subsection to section 43-28-02 of the North Dakota Century Code
 is created and enacted as follows:
- To registered dental hygienists, registered dental assistants, qualified dental
 assistants, and dental assistants practicing within the scope of practice and under
 supervision as required by chapter 43-20 and by rules.

9 SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 43-28-06 of the North Dakota
10 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- Examine applicants for licenses to practice dentistry or, dental hygiene, or dental
 <u>assisting</u> in this state, either by direct examination or by accepting the results of
 national or regional dental testing services in which the board participates or which
 the board recognizes.
- SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

17 43-28-08. Records of board - Use as evidence. The board shall keep full and 18 complete minutes of its proceedings and of its receipts and disbursements and a full and 19 accurate list of all persons licensed and registered by it. The records of the board, together 20 with the list of all licensed and registered dentists, are public records and must be open to 21 public inspection at all reasonable times. Such records, or a transcript of the same or any part 22 thereof, under the seal of the board, duly certified by its secretary-treasurer, are competent 23 evidence of the facts therein stated. A certificate of the secretary-treasurer under the seal of 24 the board stating that any person is or is not a duly licensed and registered dentist is prima 25 facie evidence of such fact.

26 **SECTION 18. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-28-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 27 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-28-10. License and certificate required - Scope of practice. A person may not
 practice dentistry in this state unless that person is a dentist. A dentist shall practice within the
 scope of that dentist's education, advanced training as recognized by the board, and any

- 1 specialty practice recognized by the American dental association or other professional entity
- 2 recognized by the board.
- 3 SECTION 19. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 43-28-11. Examination required - Application - Qualifications - Fees. An individual 6 seeking to practice dentistry in this state shall apply to the executive director of the board on 7 forms prescribed by the board and shall submit to an examination by the board. The 8 application must be verified under oath to the effect that all of the statements contained in the 9 application are true of the applicant's own knowledge, and must be received by the executive 10 director of the board at least thirty days before the date of the examination board meeting at 11 which it is considered. The applicant shall enclose with the application a recent autographed 12 picture of the applicant and an application fee as determined by the board by rule. Additional 13 costs of regional or other states' examinations as set out in section 43-28-12.1 and chargeable 14 under section 43-28-05 as board member compensation may be assessed against the 15 applicant or applicants. The applicant shall show proof that the applicant: 16 Is a graduate of a dental college recognized by the board. 1. 17 2. Is of good moral character. 18 SECTION 20. A new section to chapter 43-28 of the North Dakota Century Code is 19 created and enacted as follows: 20 **Requirements for licensure.** The board may grant a license to practice dentistry to an 21 applicant who has met all of the following requirements: 22 The applicant has a doctorate of dental surgery or doctorate of dental medicine 1. 23 degree from an accredited dental school. The applicant passed the examination administered by the joint commission on 24 2. 25 national dental examinations. 26 3. The applicant passed a clinical competency examination administered by a 27 regional dental testing service approved by the board by rule. 28 The applicant passed, within one year of making application, a written examination 4. 29 on the laws and rules governing the practice of dentistry in this state administered 30 by the board at a meeting. 31 Grounds for denial application under section 43-28-18 do not exist. 5.

6	<u>2.</u>	Licenses may be renewed by December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year by
7		submitting a renewal application, a renewal fee established by the board by rule,
8		and proof of completion of continuing education requirements established by the
9		board by rule, provided the dentist's license is not revoked or grounds for denial
10		under section 43-28-18 do not exist.
11	<u>3.</u>	If the renewal application, renewal fee, and proof of completion of continuing
12		education are not received by December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year, the
13		license expires and the dentist may not practice dentistry.
14	<u>4.</u>	For sixty days after December thirty-first of the odd-numbered year, an expired
15		license may be renewed by submitting the renewal application, renewal fee, proof
16		of completion of continuing education, and a late fee established by the board by
17		<u>rule.</u>
18	<u>5.</u>	If the renewal application, renewal fee, proof of completion of continuing education,
19		and late fee are not received within sixty days after December thirty-first of the
20		odd-numbered year, the license may not be renewed, and the dentist must apply
21		for and meet the requirements for licensure to be granted a license.
22	<u>6.</u>	The board may extend the renewal deadlines for a dentist providing proof of
23		medical or other hardship rendering the dentist unable to meet the deadline.
24	SEC	CTION 22. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:

27	applicant ha	as the necessary qualifications and successfully passes the examination for a
28	license to p	ractice dentistry in this state, or an equivalent examination in another state as set
