1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 12-48-03.1 and 12-48-03.2 of the North

2 Dakota Century Code, relating to prison industries.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12-48-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

6 12-48-03.1. The director of the department of corrections and rehabilitation may 7 establish and engage in new prison industries. The warden of the state penitentiary, under 8 the direction and with the approval of the director of the department of corrections and 9 rehabilitation, is authorized to may establish and engage in such new prison industries as the 10 director deems necessary and which are of greatest benefit to and in the best interest of the 11 state of North Dakota, the department, and offenders committed to the legal and physical 12 custody of the department. The warden, with the approval of the director, may also discontinue 13 industries when necessary. The director and the warden shall make all rules and regulations 14 and do all things necessary or incidental to the establishing and maintaining of prison industries 15 including the manufacture, sale, or distribution of prison industries produce or products, and, so 16 far as is compatible with the efficient operation of the industry, shall use offenders committed to 17 the department as laborers in such prison industries. The director and warden shall also do all 18 things necessary and incidental to the discontinuance of those industries no longer necessary 19 or beneficial to the department. Except as provided in subsections 1, 2, and 3, the director may 20 authorize the sale of selected prison industry products to wholesale and retail outlets. All other 21 prison industry products must be limited for sale to nonprofit, charitable, and tax supported 22 organizations, institutions, and agencies and to municipal, county, state, or other governmental 23 subdivisions and agencies. All governmental entities may purchase available products from the 24 prison industries unless such purchase from the prison industries is impractical or prohibited by

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1 law. The department shall keep a true and accurate account of all receipts from the established

- 2 industries and deposit the earnings in an account as provided by law. Sales of prison industry
- 3 products are subject to the following:
- 4 1. 2. All hardwood, fiberesin, upholstered, and metal art work products made in the 5 prison by roughrider industries, or other factory that manufactures the above 6 products, may be purchased directly by state governmental agencies, including 7 federal, state, and tribal agencies and political subdivisions, for use in 8 government-owned or rented buildings official business, and by nonprofit 9 organizations, excluding trade associations, fraternal organizations, co-ops, and 10 health insurance companies. All other prison-made hardwood, fiberesin, 11 upholstered, and metal art work Prison industies-made products mayalso be sold 12 only through wholesale or retail outlets that possess a valid sales tax permit or, 13 and if the products are manufactured under the prison industries enhancement 14 certification program under Public Law No. 96-157 [93 Stat. 1215; 18 U.S.C. 176(c)], in interstate commerce and through export firms for sale to international 15 16 markets. 17 Hardwood, fiberesin, upholstered, and metal art work products manufactured by 2. 18 roughrider industries, or other factory that manufactures the above products, and 19 purchased by state agencies, nonprofit organizations, and political subdivisions 20 may not be disposed of or leave the premises of the state agency, nonprofit 21 organization, and political subdivision for a period of ten years from the date of the 22 original purchase without written authorization from the director of the department 23 of corrections and rehabilitation. 24 3. Subsections 1 and 2 do not prevent the sale of prison made hardwood, fiberesin, 25
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by the director of the office of management and budget or by the director of the 27 department of corrections and rehabilitation.

28 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 12-48-03.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 29 amended and reenacted as follows:

upholstered, or metal art work products to any state institution or facility operated

- 30 12-48-03.2. Prison industry authorized to trade, barter, and exchange
- 31 merchandise, equipment, and services. Prison industry is authorized to trade, barter, and

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- 1 exchange merchandise, equipment, and services with any state agency if such is in the best
- 2 interest of the prison industry and approved by the warden and the director of the department of
- 3 corrections and rehabilitation.
