- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 27-21-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the powers and duties of the division of juvenile services; and to
- 3 create and enact a new subsection to section 27-21-12 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to the files and records of the division of juvenile services; to amend and reenact
- 5 sections 12-46-04, 12-46-09, 12-46-10, 12-46-10.1, 12-46-18, and 12-46-19 of the North
- 6 Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota youth correctional center; and to repeal
- 7 sections 12-46-03, 12-46-05, 12-46-06, 12-46-11, 12-46-20 and 12-46-22 of the North Dakota
- 8 Century Code, relating to the North Dakota youth correctional center.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12-46-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

12 12-46-04. Appointment and removal of officers. The director of the division of 13 juvenile services with the approval of the director of the department of corrections and 14 rehabilitation shall appoint the superintendent be the administrator of the North Dakota youth 15 correctional center. The superintendent may be removed by the director of the division of 16 juvenile services with the approval of the director of the department of corrections and 17 rehabilitation for misconduct, neglect of duty, incompetency, or other proper cause showing an 18 inability or refusal to properly perform the duties of the office. All other officers and employees 19 must be appointed by the superintendent, subject to the approval of the director of the division 20 of juvenile services. The superintendent shall show in the record of any officer or employee 21 who is discharged by the superintendent the reason therefor. The director may designate 22 officers or employees of the North Dakota youth correctional center to carry out the 23 administrator's duties.

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1 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 12-46-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 12-46-09. Superintendent Administrator may make rules. 4 1. The superintendent, subject to the approval of the director of the division of 5 juvenile services, shall administrator may make rules and regulations not in conflict 6 with the laws of this state: 7 1. For the admission of visitors. a. For the government of officers and employees of the North Dakota youth 8 2. b. 9 correctional center. 10 For the conduct of students children committed to the North Dakota youth 3. C. 11 correctional center. 12 <u>2.</u> A printed copy of the rules and regulations must be furnished to each student child 13 committed to the North Dakota youth correctional center at the time the student 14 child is received and to each officer or employee at the time of hire. Two copies of 15 such rules must be furnished to the state law library for the use of the state officials 16 and the public. 17 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 12-46-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 18 amended and reenacted as follows: 19 12-46-10. Records of institutional transactions, complaints, and rule infractions. 20 The superintendent administrator shall cause to be kept maintain a correct record of all the 21 transactions of the office and a correct account of all the superintendent's doings North Dakota 22 youth correctional center. The superintendent shall keep a memorandum of every complaint of 23 cruel and unjust treatment of any officer or other person, and also of any infraction of the rules 24 and regulations of the school by any of the students committed thereto, naming the student, 25 and specifying the offense and the punishment, if any, inflicted therefor, and such record and 26 memorandum must be laid before the director of the division of juvenile services upon request. 27 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 12-46-10.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 28 amended and reenacted as follows: 29 12-46-10.1. Disciplinary committee - Members - Duties. The superintendent of the 30 North Dakota youth correctional center administrator shall appoint a disciplinary committee. 31 The membership of this committee should include including one cottage supervisor, and one

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1 member of the professional staff, and may include one student and one member of the general 2 public, as determined by the superintendent. The committee shall hear all charges of serious 3 breach of discipline violations of North Dakota youth correctional center rules and regulations 4 and recommend to the superintendent administrator what disciplinary action, if any, should be 5 administered. The committee shall maintain records of its actions. These records are subject 6 to review by the director of the division of juvenile services department of corrections and 7 rehabilitation, the attorney general, or any legislative committee upon request. Nothing in this 8 section may be construed to prevent the superintendent from placing a child under close 9 supervision immediately after that child commits a serious breach of discipline, however, within 10 forty eight hours the disciplinary committee shall hear the case and make its recommendations 11 to the superintendent concerning further action to be taken, if any. 12 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 12-46-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 12-46-18. Employment and compensation of persons committed children. Every 15 person child committed to the custody of the division of juvenile services and transferred to 16 placed at the North Dakota youth correctional center or its auxiliary facilities may receive a 17 stipend as determined by the superintendent, and approved by the director of the division of 18 juvenile services administrator, within the limits of appropriations made by the legislative 19 assembly for such purpose. 20 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 12-46-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows: 22 12-46-19. Disposition of moneys earned received. The superintendent 23 administrator of the North Dakota youth correctional center shall keep a students' account 24 ledger, in which shall be opened an account with each student an account for each child placed 25 at the North Dakota youth correctional center. The earnings of each student money in each 26 child's account may be used for the child's personal needs as approved by the superintendent 27 administrator. 28 SECTION 7. A new subsection to section 27-21-02 of the North Dakota Century Code 29 is created and enacted as follows: 30 If the division of juvenile services receives any money on behalf of a child

31 <u>committed to its custody and care under this section for child support, payments in</u>

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1	excess of foster care maintenance payments, or money received from the social
2	security administration, the division may establish an account for the child and use
3	the money in a manner it determines will serve the best interests of the child,
4	including setting aside any amounts of the child's future needs or making all or part
5	of the money available to the person responsible for meeting the child's daily
6	needs to be used for the child's benefit.
7	SECTION 8. A new subsection to section 27-21-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8	created and enacted as follows:
9	The records of the division relating to a child who is or has been in the custody of
10	the division may be disclosed to any court or probation staff for use in conducting a
11	presentence investigation in a c riminal case in which the child is a defendant.
12	SECTION 9. REPEAL. Sections 12-46-03, 12-46-05, 12-46-06, 12-46-11, 12-46-20,
13	and 12-46-22 of the North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
