- 2 Century Code, relating to the facilitation of a acquisition of instructional materials in alternate
- 3 formats to students with print disabilities; to amend sections 25-06-01 and 25-06-01.1 of the
- 4 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the facilitation of acquisition of instructional materials in
- 5 alternate formats to students with print disabilities; and to provide an appropriation to the North
- 6 Dakota vision services school for the blind for the purpose of providing instructional materials
- 7 in alternate formats to students with print disabilities.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 25-06-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 11 25-06-01. North Dakota vision services school for the blind Maintained -
- 12 **Location.** There must be maintained at Grand Forks, in Grand Forks County, a statewide
- 13 service, resource, and referral center for the education and training of all residents of this state
- 14 who are blind or have a visual impairment and to serve as the national instructional materials
- accessibility center authorized user for the purpose of facilitating access to and conversion of
- 16 accessible instructional materials in alternate formats for use by blind individuals, individuals
- 17 with visual impairment and students with other print disabilities, which must be known as the
- 18 North Dakota vision services school for the blind.
- 19 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 25-06-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 20 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 21 **25-06-01.1. Definitions.** For purposes of this chapter, an:
- 22 <u>1. An</u> individual who is blind means an individual who is totally blind or whose central 23 visual acuity does not exceed twenty/two hundred in the better eye with corrective

1 lenses, or the widest diameter of the visual field is no greater than twenty degrees: 2 and an 3 An individual with a visual impairment means an individual with an impairment in 4 vision which, even with correction, adversely affects the individual's functional 5 ability; and 6 A student with print disabilities means a student enrolled in elementary or 7 secondary school who has an individualized education program, which includes 8 documentation of either an inability to read or use standard printed material as a 9 result of physical limitations, or a reading disability resulting from an organic 10 dysfunction that has been certified by competent authority to be of sufficient 11 severity to prevent reading of printed material in a normal manner. 12 **SECTION 3.** A new subsection to section 25-06-02 of the North Dakota Century Code 13 is created and enacted as follows: 14 Serve as the national instructional materials accessibility center authorized user for the purpose of facilitating access to and conversion of accessible instructional 15 16 materials in alternate formats for use by blind individuals, individuals with visual 17 impairment and students with other print disabilities. 18 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 19 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 20 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind 21 for the purpose of serving as the national instructional materials accessibility center authorized 22 user to facilitate access to and conversion of accessible instructional materials in alternate 23 formats for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, as follows: 24 Salaries and wages \$47,808 25 Operating expenses 4,554 26 \$52,362 Total general fund appropriation 27 FTE .50
