- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 12-60 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century code, relating to lost, missing or runaway children; and to amend and reenact section
- 3 54-23.2-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to lost or missing persons; and to
- 4 repeal section 54-23.2-04.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to school enrollment
- 5 procedures to aid in the identification and location of missing children.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. Two new sections to chapter 12-60 of the North Dakota Century Code are created and enacted as follows:

Lost, runaway, or missing children. The bureau shall:

- Establish and maintain a statewide file system for the purpose of effecting an immediate law enforcement response to reports of lost, runaway, or missing children.
- 2. Implement a data exchange system to compile, to maintain, and to make available for dissemination to North Dakota and out-of-state law enforcement agencies, descriptive information that can assist appropriate agencies in recovering lost, missing, or runaway children.
 - 3. Establish contacts and exchange information regarding lost, missing, or runaway children with the national crime information center.
 - 4. Notify all enforcement agencies that reports of lost, missing, or runaway children must be entered as soon as the minimum level of data specified by the bureau is available to the reporting agency and that no waiting period for entry of such data exists. If the enforcement agency is unable to enter the data, the bureau immediately upon notification shall enter the information into the national crime information center file.

23	<u>1.</u>	Whe	en a child enrolls in a public or nonpublic school, licensed day care facility,				
24		home education, licensed day care center, licensed child care facility, headstart					
25		program, or nursery school for the first time, the school, licensed day care facility,					
26		<u>hea</u>	dstart program, or school superintendent of the jurisdiction shall:				
27		<u>a.</u>	Require the child's parent, guardian, or legal custodian to present to the				
28			school, licensed day care facility, or school superintendent of the jurisdiction,				
29			within forty days of enrollment, proof of identity of the child; and				

ı		<u>n. Request the appropriate school records for the child from the previous school</u>		
2		attended by the child. The school enrolling the child shall make the request		
3		within thirty days of enrollment of the child.		
4	<u>2.</u>	If a child's parent, guardian, or legal custodian does not present the proof of		
5		identity required in subsection 1 within forty days of enrollment or if the school does		
6		not receive the school records of the child within sixty days of enrollment, the		
7		school, licensed day care facility, or school superintendent of the jurisdiction shall		
8		notify the bureau and a local law enforcement authority that no proof of identify has		
9		been presented for the child.		
10	<u>3.</u>	A school shall transfer records or proof of identity of a child within ten calendar		
11		days upon receipt of request.		
12	<u>4.</u>	When a school, licensed day care facility, or school superintendent receives a		
13		notice from a law enforcement authority, parent, guardian, or legal custodian that a		
14		child who is or has been enrolled in that school or facility has been reported as a		
15		lost, missing, or runaway child, the school, licensed day care facility, or school		
16		superintendent shall:		
17		a. Flag the records of the child; and		
18		b. Notify the bureau and a local law enforcement authority if a request for school		
19		records is received from any source.		
20	<u>5.</u>	When the division of vital records of the state department of health receives a		
21		notice from a law enforcement authority that a child is reported as lost, missing, or		
22		runaway, the division of vital records shall:		
23		a. Flag the records of the individual; and		
24		b. Notify the bureau and a local law enforcement authority if a request for		
25		records is received from any source.		
26	<u>6.</u>	If it is necessary for law enforcement authorities to conduct an investigation on a		
27		lost, missing, or runaway child, school or day care personnel may not inform the		
28		person claiming custody of the child of the investigation while it is being conducted.		
29	<u>7.</u>	For purposes of this section:		
30		a. "Flag the records' means marking the division of vital records, school day		
31		care, or home education records in such a manner that any personnel viewing		

1			that record will be automatically alerted that the child or individual has been			
2			reported as lost, missing, or runaway.			
3		<u>b.</u>	"Home education: means a program of education supervised by a child's			
4			parent, in the child's home, in accordance with the requirements of chapter			
5			<u>15.1-23.</u>			
6		<u>c.</u>	"Proof of identify" means a certified copy of a birth certificate, a certified			
7			transcript, or similar student records from the previous school, or any other			
8			documentary evidence the school, licensed day care facility, or school			
9			superintendent considers appropriate proof of identity.			
10		<u>d.</u>	"School" or "licensed day care facility" means all elementary and secondary			
11			schools, licensed day care centers, licensed child care facilities, headstart			
12			programs, and nursery schools whether public or nonpublic.

The enforcement agency is responsible for maintaining the 5 disposition of the case and periodically shall review the case with the reporting 6 party and the division to ensure all available information is included and to 7 determine the current status of the case. 8 Provide prompt confirmation of the receipt and entry of the lost or runaway children 9 and missing persons report into the file system to the enforcement agency 10 providing the report or to the parent, guardian, or identified family member as 11 provided in subsection 7. 12 7. Allow any parent, guardian, or identified family member to submit a lost or missing 13 persons report to the division which will be included in the division file system and 14 transmitted to the national crime information center, if they are unable to receive 15 services from the local law enforcement agency. 16 8.
